

## Public backs plans for Bow

BOW interchange is to be made safer for pedestrians after 86 per cent of respondents backed the changes set out in a recent consultation.

The work, expected to begin later this year, will create new signalised crossings at the roundabout, an area of public space under the flyover and links to the routes along the River Lea towpath.

Work will be coordinated with the upgrade of the Cycle Superhighway between Bow roundabout and Aldgate, due to be completed by summer 2016.

Long-term proposals are also being worked on that could see the flyover and roundabout removed. The changes would focus on improving access to new developments in the locality and also see the bus network extended to communities in Tower Hamlets and Newham.



A consultation on these changes will take place next year.

The improvements to Bow interchange and Cycle Superhighway form part of TfL's Road Modernisation Plan which will see £4 billion invested in hundreds of projects on the road network.

# New lease of life for Tottenham Court Road

ICONIC mosaic work from Tottenham Court Road station is to be restored by students at the Edinburgh College of Art.

Although 95 per cent of the mosaics, designed by sculptor Eduardo Paolozzi in the 1980s, will remain at Tottenham Court Road, some needed to be removed while the station undergoes a complete upgrade.

The remainder will now be carefully transported to the art institution in Paolozzi's home city where he studied in 1943 and later became a visiting professor.

The University will use the mosaics in conservation training and from next year a new undergraduate programme, Edinburgh Collections, will incorporate the Paolozzi mosaics project. In the next few years, the pieces will be photographed and digitally mapped, allowing experts to virtually reconstruct the artwork as before.

Toby Treves from the Paolozzi Foundation said: 'Eduardo

Paolozzi's work at Tottenham Court Road station has delighted Tube passengers for more than 30 years and will continue to do so far into the future. The work with Edinburgh will provide a fitting home for the pieces that could not be accommodated at the station as it is modernised. It will also serve to further promote public appreciation

of the fine arts and the extraordinary contribution of Eduardo Paolozzi.'

The mosaics are an important part of the Tube's heritage and London Underground has worked closely with the Paolozzi Foundation, historians and design and conservation professionals, to protect and renovate them and find a fitting home for the last pieces.

Roads closed for the Prudential RideLondon FreeCycle event including Chancery Lane, High Holborn, Waterloo Bridge, Trafalgar Square and Parliament Square.

**London**  
August 2, 4am to 8.30pm

Extensive road closures for the Prudential RideLondon event. Roads will be reopened once it is safe to do so.

**Wembley Stadium**  
August 2, 12.30 to 7.30pm

Heavy traffic and crowds expected in the area for the FA Community Shield. Kick off is at 3pm.

**Parliament Square**  
August 3, 7am to November 30, 6pm

Side roads closed and lane restrictions from Parliament Square to Victoria Street's junction with Storey's Gate for utility works. Buckingham Gate will close and three-way traffic signals will operate.

Road closed, eastbound, between St James's Square and Cockspur Street for utility works. A contraflow will be in operation. Lane restrictions in Cockspur Street and Haymarket, plus Waterloo Place at the junction of Charles II Street will be closed southbound.
