1 April 2013 – 31 March 2014

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1. Introduction

This annual summary bulletin brings together crime statistics from the Metropolitan Police Service (MPS) and British Transport Police (BTP) and Transport for London (TfL) to provide a summary of recorded crime upon TfL services during Financial Year (FY) 2013/14 (1 April 2013 – 31 March 2014). This annual bulletin focuses on the London Bus network, London Underground (LU) / Docklands Light Railway (DLR)¹, London Tramlink and London Overground (LO) service.

The figures reported in this bulletin for the bus network are based on official MPS figures for bus-related crime unless otherwise stated. There is no distinct category of 'bus crime' in the MPS crime recording system. Recorded crime data is extracted from the MPS system using a complex query that searches all MPS crime for transport venue codes and those that have the word bus, bus stop, bus station and transport related words somewhere in the electronic case file. For this reason, some crimes that did not occur on the bus network will be included in the figures. This is different from the BTP as all crimes dealt with by the BTP and included on their crime recording system relate directly to the rail network.

Recorded crime figures relate to crime recorded by the MPS and BTP during FY 2013/14 and are consistent with Home Office counting rules. The figures do not include crimes that have not been reported to the police or those that the police decide not to record.

Public transport in London continues to be a relatively safe and low crime environment. Currently, over ten million passengers travel on the TfL's public transport services each day with very few of them ever experiencing or witnessing crime.

Despite low levels of crime of the network, increases were seen in some crime types on some modes compared with the previous year. These increases are largely attributable to an increase in TfL and its police partners are redoubling their efforts and have put measures in place to deal with those issues.

The headline figures include:

- The levels of pan-modal transport crime² in 2013/14 were 11.3% lower (3,866 fewer offences) than in 2012/13 and the rate of crime has decreased to 7.7 crimes per million passenger journeys (from 8.9 in 2012/13), as can be seen in chart 1 and table 1.
- Levels of bus-related crime in 2013/14 were 9.9% lower (1,982 fewer offences) than in 2012/13 and the rate of crime for the bus network has fallen to 7.5 crimes per million passenger journeys (from 8.6 in 2012/13).
- Crime on LU/DLR decreased during 2013/14 by 14.4% (1,846 fewer offences) than in 2012/13 with the rate of crime falling to 8.0 crimes per million passenger journeys.
- Crime on London Overground (LO) has increased during 2013/14 by 0.1% (1 additional offence) compared with the previous year, despite a significant increase in passenger journeys of around 11 million. Crime on LO remains at a very low level and is one of safest modes of travel in London. The rate of crime fell to 6.2 from 6.7 in 2012/13.
- Crime on London Tramlink has fallen by 10.8% during 2013/14 (39 fewer offences) compared with 2012/13 with the rate of crime falling to 10.3 crimes per million passenger journeys (from 12.0 in 2012/13).

¹ Crime figures for LU and DLR are reported together as these networks are policed by the same division of the BTP.

² The pan-modal transport crime figure and rate is based on the aggregate crime and passenger journey figures for the bus, LU/DLR, Tramlink and LO networks.

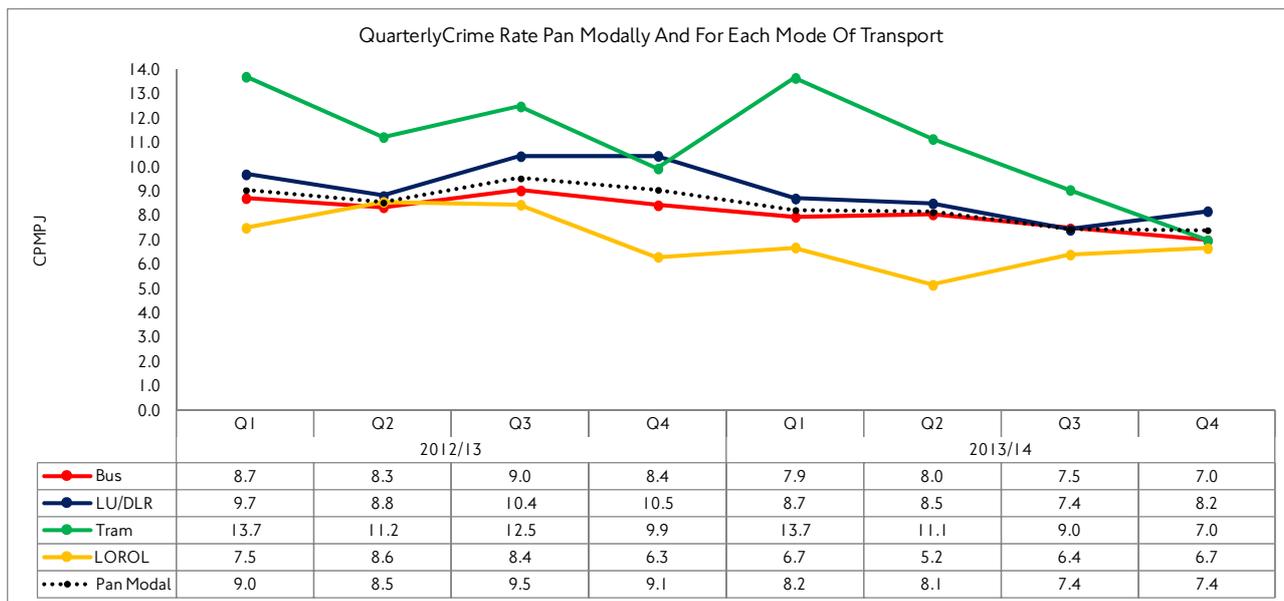

2. Bus-related Crime 2010/11–2013/14

Table 2 shows the break-down of MPS bus-related³ crime by the major crime categories used by the MPS for 2010/11, 2011/12, 2012/13 and 2013/14 and includes the rate of crime⁴ for each of these categories with the exception of burglary⁵. In 2013/14, there were 7.5 crimes for every million passenger journeys made on the bus network. Borough bus-related crime figures are shown in table 3.

³ The crime figures published in this bulletin are based on figures produced by the Metropolitan Police Performance Information Bureau at the end of each financial year. These figures are not updated retrospectively.

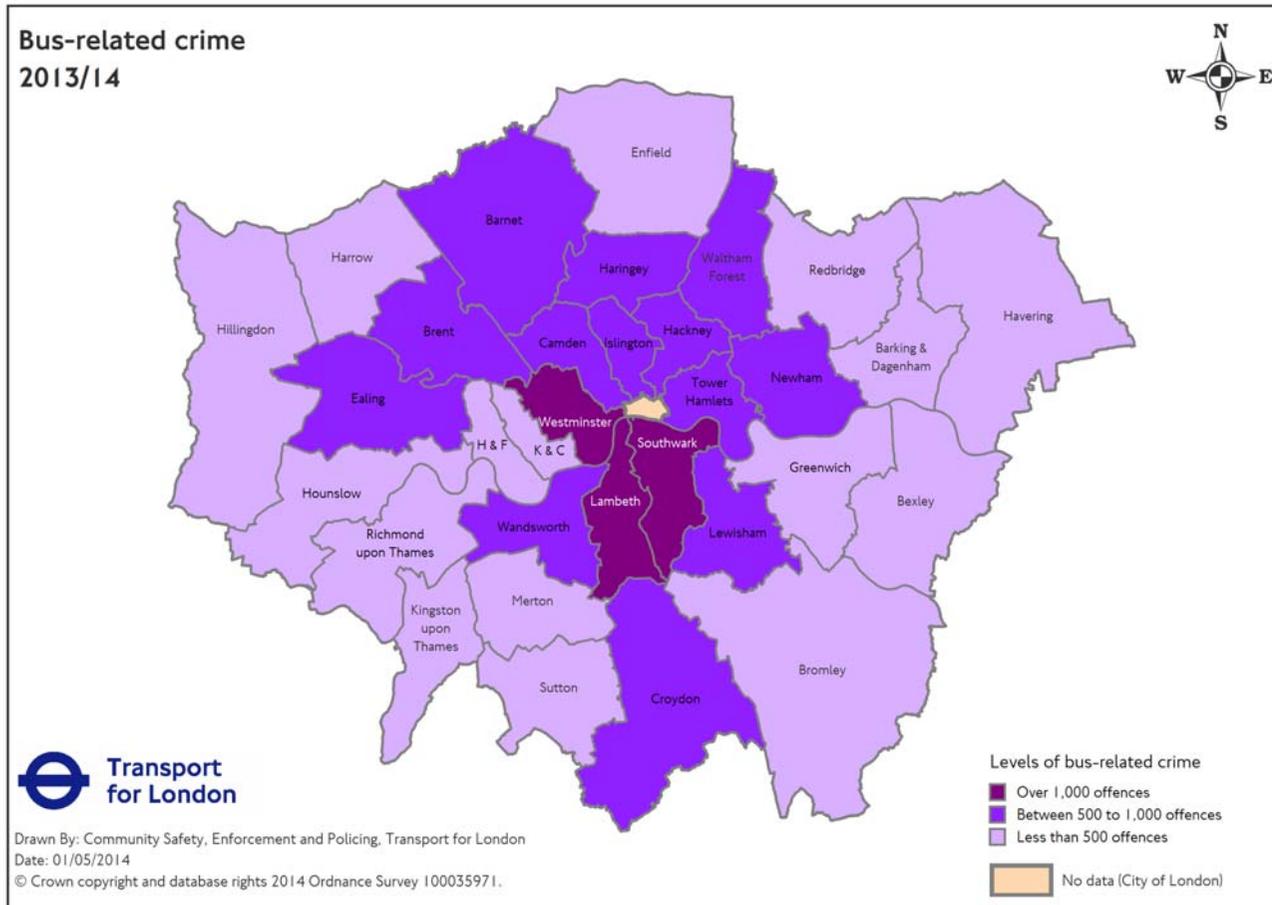
⁴ Rate of crime per million passenger journeys is calculated by dividing the number of crimes by the number of passenger journeys multiplied by one million.

⁵ Most burglaries take place in buildings and therefore it is not appropriate to calculate crime rates for burglary based on the number of passenger journeys made on the bus network.

* Bus-related crime rates for 2010/11, 2011/12, 2012/13 and 2013/14 are based on annual passenger journey figures of 2.289b, 2.344b, 2.335b and 2.405b respectively.

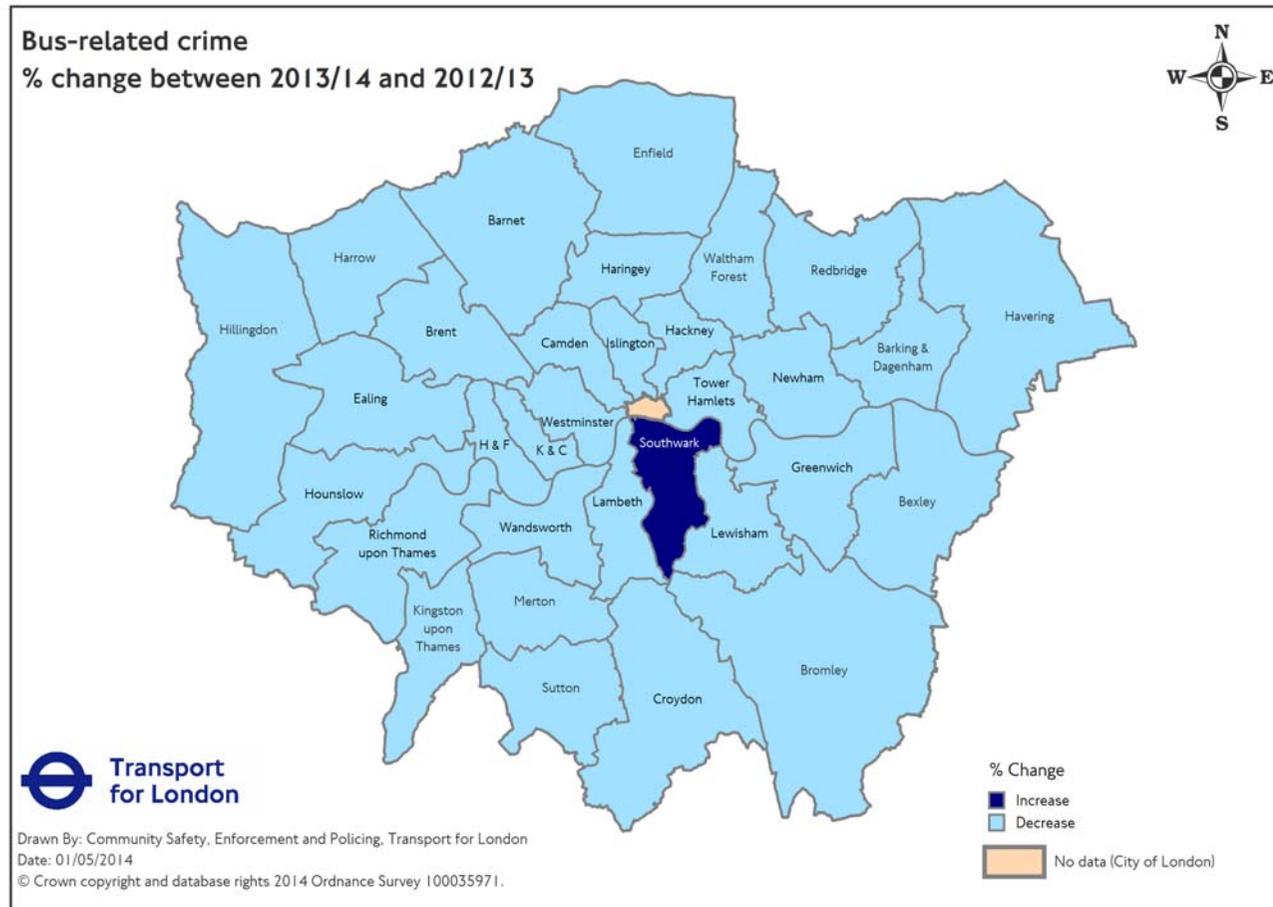
Map 1 – Bus-related crime volume by borough

Map 1 shows the breakdown of MPS bus-related crime by borough for 2013/14. The darker shades of purple show the boroughs with the highest number of recorded bus-related crimes. The map has not been adjusted for passenger or population numbers. Borough bus-related crime figures are shown in Table 3. Please note that the map below does not include data for the City of London; this is policed by the City of London Police (CoLP) which is a separate police force from the MPS.



Map 2 – Bus-related crime change between 2012/13 and 2013/14 by borough

Map 2 shows the percentage change in the levels of bus-related crime by borough⁶ between 2012/13 and 2013/14. The lighter blue boroughs have seen reductions in crime. The boroughs shaded in the darkest blue have seen an increase in levels of crime. Borough bus-related crime figures are shown in Table 3.



⁶ It is not possible to create similar maps of BTP recorded crime. The exact location of crimes upon the rail network is unknown due to some victims identifying the offence at the end of their journey which was undertaken across more than one borough.

3. London Underground and Docklands Light Railway Crime 2010/11–2013/14

Table 4 provides a breakdown of the major crime categories⁷ used by the BTP for the LU and DLR networks in 2010/11, 2011/12, 2012/13 and 2013/14⁸. There were 8.0 crimes for every million passenger journeys made on the LU and DLR networks in 2013/14.

4. London Overground Crime 2010/11 – 2013/14

Table 5 provides a breakdown of the major crime categories used by the BTP for the LO network in 2010/11, 2011/12, 2012/13 and 2013/14⁹. There were 6.2 crimes for every million passenger journeys made on the LO network in 2013/14¹⁰.

¹⁰ Passenger data is only available from November 2010, hence the absence of rate information before 2011/12.

¹¹ The LO crime data has been adjusted to account for a change in reporting practice whereby offences recorded at stations managed by other train operating companies but used by LO (e.g. Barking, Watford Junction) have been removed unless they have taken place on the LO services to avoid duplication as these are included in other BTP policing divisions statistics. All data from previous years has been adjusted accordingly.

5. London Tramlink Crime 2010/11 – 2013/14

Table 6 provides a breakdown of the major crime categories used by the BTP for the London Tramlink network in 2010/11, 2011/12, 2012/13 and 2013/14¹². There were 10.3 crimes for every million passenger journeys made on the London Tramlink network in 2013/14.
