



Is it the end of the road for Archway gyratory?

THE busy Archway gyratory could be set for a facelift which will benefit local residents and introduce safer, more direct routes for traffic.

The radical redesign would completely transform the area. The out-of-date road system would be replaced with two-way traffic, segregated cycle lanes introduced and improvements made to pedestrian crossings. A new, public open space would

also be created outside Archway Tube station in the heart of the town.

The proposals are part of the £4billion Road Modernisation Plan for London announced by the Mayor. TfL and Islington Council have worked closely together on developing the scheme.

The new layout, which is now out for consultation, would see traffic flowing both ways around three quarters of the town.

Subject to the outcome of the consultation, work could begin as early as 2016 and be completed during 2017.

Battle Bus marks London's Remembrance parade

LONDON Transport Museum's recently restored Battle Bus was at Parliament Square on Sunday along with members of the London Transport Old Comrades Association.

The city's transport staff and buses played a vital role in the First World War. More than 1,000 workers were called up to fight and buses and coaches were used to mobilise troops, converted to ambulances and played a leading role in evacuating inner-city children.

To mark the centenary of the war, passengers at Covent Garden, Oval and Westminster stations will hear war poems, letters and readings today over the PA system.
