Routemaster bus, the bag measures 25cm x 30cm, making it perfect for school trips, sleepovers and PE kit.

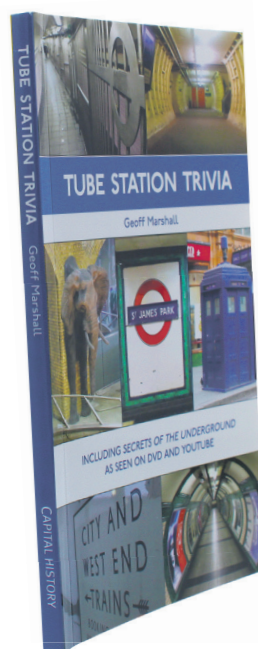
ROUNDEL ICE CUBE TRAY £7.99

Hidden London secrets unwrapped

IF you want to push the boat out this Christmas, why not give the gift of a Hidden London Clapham South Subterranean shelter tour?

Journey 180 steps underground to explore one of London's eight deep-level shelters. Opened to the public in July 1944, Clapham South shelter has more than a mile of subterranean passageways that reveal the extraordinary stories of those who sheltered there.

Occupants included Londoners seeking refuge during the Blitz, Caribbean migrants arriving on the Empire Windrush, and even some thrifty visitors to the Festival of Britain.
