IMPROVEMENTS UNDER WAY

There are no planned works on the Bakerloo, Central, Circle, District, Hammersmith & City, Jubilee, Metropolitan, Piccadilly, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines, or London Trams. However, the following lines will be affected by engineering and improvement works.

Northern line Part closure

All weekend: no service between Archway and High Barnet/Mill Hill East owing to track replacement work at Finchley Central. Replacement bus services will run:

Service A: Archway - Highgate - East Finchley - Finchley Central - West Finchley - Woodside Park - Totteridge & Whetstone - High Barnet.

Service C: Finchley Central - Mill Hill East.

The car park at Finchley Central station will be closed from 8pm until Monday.

DLR Part closure

All weekend: no service between Bank/Tower Gateway and Blackwall/All Saints/Canary Wharf owing to improvement and maintenance work. There will be no direct service from Woolwich Arsenal, Beckton and Lewisham to Bank or Tower Gateway station. Replacement buses will run between Blackwall and All Saints. The buses will not serve Tower Gateway - use local buses.

London Overground Part closure

All weekend: no service between Gospel Oak and Barking owing to Network Rail work to enable new, longer trains to run from 2018. Replacement bus services will run between Gospel Oak and Seven Sisters (for South Tottenham), and between Walthamstow Central and Barking. At East Ham, eastbound buses will set down only and westbound buses will pick up only. Use local buses between South Tottenham and Walthamstow Queen's Road. Use Tube services between Finsbury Park and Walthamstow Central, and between East Ham and Barking. Passengers should be aware that the line is closed between South Tottenham and Barking on weekdays. Use Tube services via all reasonable routes or the replacement buses.

All weekend: no service between Clapham Junction and Willesden Junction owing to Earls Court Development and Network Rail infrastructure work. Use local buses.

Sunday: no service between Surrey Quays and Clapham Junction owing to Network Rail track work. Use local buses.

TfL Rail Part closure

All weekend: no service between Liverpool Street and Stratford owing to Network Rail track work. Use Tube services instead. Replacement buses will run between Liverpool Street and Stratford until 7.10am and after 11.50pm.

Closure of Lambeth North station

LAMBETH North Tube station will close on July 13 and is expected to reopen in mid-February next year.

The closure will enable two lifts to be replaced. The existing ones are nearly 30 years old and fail regularly, causing travel disruption.

During this time, customers are advised to use neighbouring stations - Waterloo (a ten-minute

walk) or Elephant & Castle (a 15-minute walk). Lambeth North is also well served by ten bus routes, connecting passengers to a number of locations, including alternative Tube stations.

Visitors heading for the Imperial War Museum can use local bus services from Waterloo or Elephant & Castle.



Sunday fun on Regent Street

Wireless Festival at Finsbury Park

THE Wireless Festival begins today at Finsbury Park and runs until Sunday.

Finsbury Park Tube station is expected to be extremely busy after 10pm each evening and festival-goers are advised to use the Piccadilly line from Manor House or National Rail services from Finsbury Park.

Passengers not going to the festival are advised to change between National Rail and Tube services at King's Cross St. Pancras to avoid the queueing system at Finsbury Park.

Special arrangements will be in place after the festival each evening.

At Finsbury Park, after 10pm:

- Queueing system to enter via Wells Terrace
 - Exit only via Station Place
 - Seven Sisters Road exit will be closed
- At Manor House, after 10.30pm:
- The entrance on Green Lanes by the park gates will be entry only
 - The entrance on Seven Sisters Road (south side) will be exit only
 - All other entrances will be closed
