

Keeping London moving during strike action

TRANSPORT for London (TfL) has confirmed the Underground services it intends to run during the RMT and TSSA strike.

If strike action goes ahead, services will be affected from around 9.30pm tonight until Friday morning, and around 9.30pm on February 11 until the morning of February 14.

TfL will keep as many stations open and run as many trains as possible. Tube services will start later and finish earlier than normal – from around 7am to 11pm. The following lines are expected to run:

Bakerloo

Trains will run between Queen's Park and Elephant & Castle every six



minutes in both directions.

Trains will not stop at Edgware Road, Embankment, Kilburn Park, Lambeth North, Maida Vale, Piccadilly Circus or Regent's Park stations.

Central line

No service to operate through the central area. Trains will run:

- Between Epping and Leytonstone every 12 minutes in both directions
- Between West Ruislip and White City every 15 minutes in both directions

Circle line

See District line, Hammersmith & City line and Metropolitan line.

District line

Trains will run:

- Between Upminster and Wimbledon every eight minutes in both directions
- Between Ealing Broadway and High Street Kensington every 20 minutes in both directions

Trains will not stop at Aldgate East, Becontree, Blackfriars, Bromley-by-Bow, Dagenham East, Dagenham Heathway, East Ham, Elm Park, Gloucester Road, Hornchurch, Plaistow, Sloane Square, Stepney Green, Temple, Upminster Bridge, Upney or Upton Park stations.

Hammersmith & City line

Trains will run between Hammersmith and Moorgate every 10 minutes in both directions.

Trains will not stop at Barbican, Euston Square and Great Portland Street stations.

Jubilee line

Trains will run:

- Between Stanmore and Finchley Road around every five minutes in both directions
- Between Waterloo and Stratford every five minutes in both directions

Trains will not stop at Bermondsey and Southwark stations.

Metropolitan line

Trains will run between Harrow-on-the-Hill and Aldgate every 10 minutes in both directions.

Trains will not stop at Barbican, Euston Square, Great Portland Street, Northwick Park and Preston Road stations.

Northern line

Trains will run over the whole line (except to Mill Hill East), with a service around every five minutes via Bank and Charing Cross branches in both directions.

Trains will not stop at Borough, Chalk Farm, Clapham North, Clapham South, Colliers Wood, Embankment, Goodge Street, Hampstead, Highgate, Leicester Square, Mornington Crescent, Old Street, Oval, South Wimbledon,

Tooting Bec, Tufnell Park and Warren Street stations.

Piccadilly line

No service through the central area. Trains will run:

- Between Acton Town and Heathrow Terminals 1,2,3 around every 10 minutes in both directions
- Between Arncliffe and Cockfosters around every 10 minutes in both directions

Trains will stop at Heathrow Terminal 4 or Southgate stations.

Victoria line

Trains will run between Seven Sisters and Victoria around every five minutes in both directions.

Trains will not stop at Warren Street station.

Waterloo & City line

No service.

Other transport services are expected to be busy. London bus services will be boosted with more than 100 extra buses on key routes. London River Services will also offer an enhanced service.

London Overground, DLR and Barclays Cycle Hire will operate as normal.

Tube improvements – post weekend update



Metropolitan line:

- 353metres of drainage pipes were installed between Hillingdon and Ickenham
- 615metres of track were replaced between Preston Road and Wembley Park, and 200 metres in the Willesden Green area
- 6.5km of track was worked on to reduce noise and vibration, giving a more comfortable ride

On the Jubilee line:

Tunnel strengthening work took place between Bond Street and Baker Street

Northern line:

New signalling was tested on the Edgware branch
