IMPROVEMENTS UNDER WAY

There are no planned works on the Bakerloo, Circle, District, Hammersmith & City, Jubilee, Metropolitan, Northern, Piccadilly, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines, Docklands Light Railway, London Trams or TfL Rail. However, the following lines will be affected by engineering and improvement works.

Central line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Marble Arch and Bethnal Green owing to points renewal work at Holborn and Bank. Use alternative Tube lines and/or local buses.

London Overground

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Gospel Oak and Barking while Network Rail carries out work to enable new, longer trains to run from 2018. Replacement buses will run between Gospel Oak and Seven Sisters (for South Tottenham), and between Walthamstow Central and Barking.

Sunday: no service until 10.15am between Liverpool Street and Chingford owing to Network Rail track work. Replacement buses will run.

Sunday: no service between Hackney Downs and Enfield Town/Cheshunt (via Seven Sisters) owing to Network Rail track work. Replacement buses will run between Seven Sisters and Enfield Town, and between Seven Sisters and Cheshunt. After 10.15am, the Chingford service will also call at Cambridge Heath and London Fields.

Monday May 23 to Thursday May 26: no service after 10.30pm between Hackney Downs and Chingford owing to Network Rail track work. Replacement buses will run.

Cup final day at Wembley

THIS season's FA Cup final sees Manchester United take on Crystal Palace under the Wembley arch at 5.30pm on Saturday.

There will be large crowds in the area and congestion is expected on the roads around the stadium before and after the game.

Public transport will be busier than usual, so customers are encouraged to check before they travel.

Sunday also sees the FA Vase final between Hereford and Morpeth Town, with kick-off at 12.15pm. Crowds are expected in the area before and after the game.



All aboard for a bus garage open day

SHEPHERD'S Bush Bus Garage in west London will welcome the public tomorrow to mark the start of this year's bus garage open days across the capital.

The events have become a regular feature since they were first held to mark the Year of the Bus celebrations in 2014.

Visitors to the garage on Wells Road on Saturday will have the chance to view two heritage vehicles from London Transport Museum's collections, enjoy 'make and take' family activities, have a guided tour of the garage to see the vehicle docks, vehicle maintenance and coach-making areas, and take a free trip on vintage buses.

There will be tours departing from the forecourt every 15-20 minutes from 10am until 3.15pm.

Entry is free and all proceeds from voluntary activities will be donated to Shooting Stars Children's Hospice, a leading children's charity which cares for babies, children and young people with life-limiting conditions, and their families.
