

Plan your weekend travel

Find out about line closures and alternative travel options at tfl.gov.uk

There are no planned works on the Bakerloo, Central, Jubilee, Northern, Piccadilly, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines. However, the following lines will be affected by engineering and improvement works.

Circle line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Edgware Road and Tower Hill (via King's Cross St. Pancras) for track and points replacement work and Crossrail works. A special Circle line service will operate between Edgware Road and Barking (via Victoria).

District line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Edgware Road and High Street Kensington or between Earl's Court and Kensington (Olympia) while new signalling is tested. Use alternative Tube lines or buses.

Hammersmith & City line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Edgware Road and Barking for track and points replacement work and Crossrail works. A special Circle line service will operate between Edgware Road and Barking (via Victoria).

Metropolitan line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Baker Street and Aldgate for track and points replacement and Crossrail works. Use alternative Tube lines or buses.

London Overground

Part closure

Romford to Upminster route

All weekend: no service between Romford and Upminster owing to Crossrail and Network Rail works. Use local buses.

Highbury & Islington to West Croydon/Clapham Junction route

Sunday: No service between New Cross Gate and Crystal Palace/West Croydon owing to Network Rail track work. Replacement buses will run.

Watford Junction to Euston route

Sunday: no service between Kilburn High Road and Euston from 11.30am to 9.15pm owing to Network Rail work at Euston to enable High Speed Two (HS2). Use local buses or Tube services.

Liverpool Street to Enfield Town /Cheshunt (via Seven Sisters)/Chingford route

Sunday: no service, southbound, between Liverpool Street and Chingford until 7am owing to Network Rail track work.

Sunday: no service at Bethnal Green to/from Chingford until 11.59pm. Use Enfield Town/Cheshunt trains.

Gospel Oak to Barking route

Until late February: no service between Gospel Oak and Barking to enable Network Rail to prepare the line for new, longer trains that will run from next year. Replacement bus services will operate.

Service J: Gospel Oak (bus stops in Highgate Road) – Upper Holloway – Crouch Hill (bus stops in Hornsey Road) – Finsbury Park – Harringay Green Lanes – Seven Sisters (for South Tottenham).

Service T: Walthamstow Central – Leyton Midland Road – Leytonstone High Road (bus stops at Harrow Green) – Wanstead Park – Woodgrange Park – East Ham – Barking.

Use the Tube or local buses between Seven Sisters and Walthamstow Central.

TfL Rail

Full closure

Weekends in February and March: no service between Liverpool Street and Shenfield for Network Rail track and station improvements, plus Crossrail construction work. Replacement buses will run:

Stratford – Forest Gate – Manor Park – Ilford – Seven Kings – Goodmayes – Chadwell Heath – Romford.

Newbury Park (for the Central line) – Chadwell Heath – Romford – Gidea Park – Harold Wood – Brentwood – Shenfield.

Docklands Light Rail

Station closed

Until December: trains will not be stopping at Custom House while station works are carried out in preparation for the start of Elizabeth line services. Use local buses.

London Trams

Part closure

Until February 19: no service between Wimbledon and Mitcham owing to track renewal work. Replacement buses will run.

Heading to the museum?

THERE is refurbishment work taking place at the Natural History Museum until the summer, which means the main entrance will be closed.

The best travel option to reach the Queen's Gate entrance is to use Gloucester Road station on the Circle, District or Piccadilly lines. From there it is a short, signed walk along Cromwell Road into Queen's Gate.

London Overground Trains stopping early

LATE night London Overground services between Liverpool Street and Enfield Town/Cheshunt via Seven Sisters will finish at 10.45pm between Monday and Thursday next week while Network Rail carries out some infrastructure work.

Customers are advised to use Greater Anglia services between Liverpool Street and Cheshunt via Tottenham Hale or local Tube services.

Replacement bus services will also operate.
