

# Plan ahead for the Winter Run

The capital's streets will be filled with runners on Sunday as the Cancer Research UK London Winter Run returns for its third year.

ABOUT 12,500 participants will take part in the 10km race along a route that passes some of the capital's most famous landmarks, including St Paul's Cathedral, the Cenotaph and Trafalgar Square.

Roads along the route will be closed until around 4.30pm and drivers are encouraged to allow extra time or consider alternative options.

Affected roads include Pall Mall, the Strand, Trafalgar Square and approach roads, The Mall, Whitehall, Cannon Street (between Queen Victoria Street and St Paul's Churchyard), Cheapside and Fleet Street (between Strand and Fetter Lane). Waterloo Bridge will be closed but traffic

will still be able to access the underpass except between 9am and 11.15am.

Buses on routes in and around central London will be diverted or will terminate early until around 4.30pm. Delays are also likely.

Tube and rail will be the best way to get around central London, although some stations in the area will be busier than usual, including Bank (Northern and Central lines only), Embankment (Bakerloo line only), St Paul's (Central line) and Westminster (District line only).

## Advance warning of Tube strike

TUBE customers should be aware that a strike is planned from Sunday evening.

If the strike goes ahead there will be a significant impact on journeys across central London from 8pm on Sunday until about 9am on Wednesday February 8.

### Travel advice

#### Tube

TfL will open as many stations as possible, but for safety reasons many of them, especially those in zone 1, will not open at all or close at short notice.

#### Buses

Services, especially near National Rail stations, will be extremely busy, so customers are advised to complete journeys from these stations on foot if possible.

#### Road

Journeys will take significantly longer than usual and drivers are advised to only come in to central London if it's essential. If you can't avoid driving, use the north and south circular roads and/or the M25.

### Plan ahead

TfL will be deploying Travel Ambassadors to help customers get around, and there will be posters and announcements at



stations keeping people informed of the latest levels of service.
