Whether you're commuting, taking a leisurely trip, sightseeing or want to have dinner with a difference, this could be the choice for you.

River Bus

A guaranteed seat, refreshments and spectacular views: three things you may not associate with rush hour. Aboard MBNA Thames Clippers you can sit back and enjoy the ride with a hot coffee in your hand. Taking a family trip at the weekend? Grab a drink for the kids and let them take photos of the views while you can enjoy a few



moments of quiet.
Five routes operate between Putney



and Woolwich, so there are many places to visit. You can save 10 per cent on pay as you go fares with an Oyster card (except on the RB6 Putney route). All boats are wheelchair accessible by ramp, and allow bikes and dogs on board.

River Tours

Sightseeing tours

Have friends in town who want to see the sights? Or would you like to see the city from the water? Get on board a sightseeing tour and spot some of London's most iconic landmarks. Circular and hop-on hop-off cruises operate between Greenwich and Westminster. Discounts are available for Travel card holders on most services. Tours are run throughout the year by Thames River Services, Circular Cruise Westminster, City Cruises and London Eye River Cruises. In the summer, Thames River Boats and Turks Launches also run services to Richmond, Kew and Hampton Court.

Speedboat experiences

Do you have the need for speed? Take a speedboat tour and zoom down the Thames past some of London's favourite sights. There's commentary, too. Speedboat trips are run by Thames RIB Experience, London RIB Voyages and Thamesjet.

Dining cruises

The only thing better than a beautifully prepared meal, is a stunning view while you eat. Whether you wish to have a relaxing lunch or afternoon tea on a daytime cruise, or an indulgent dinner in the evening, these cruises are perfect for any occasion. Dining cruises are provided by Bateaux London and City Cruises.

For a birthday with a difference, you could hire a river boat for an unforgettable experience. There are a variety of charter boat operators that offer tickets for scheduled party cruises as well as personalised private party packages.
