London Overground Part closure

Sunday: Trains to/from Chingford will not stop at Bethnal Green until 11.59pm, owing to Network Rail track work. Use Enfield Town or Cheshunt trains instead.

TfL Rail Part closure

Saturday: From 9pm there will be a reduced service of two trains an hour between Paddington and Heathrow. Trains will not stop at Acton Main Line station, owing to Crossrail work.

Sunday: Until 7am there will be no service between Paddington and Heathrow Terminals 2 & 3.

Bank branch trains now stopping at Kennington

CUSTOMERS are advised that trains on the Bank branch of the Northern line are now stopping at Kennington Tube station.

The interchange between the Bank and Charing Cross branches has also been restored. However, there may continue to be changes to the timetable until late September.

This is owing to ongoing essential work to build new passageways for the Northern Line Extension. Once complete, the new

passageways will make it quicker and easier for customers to change between the Northern line branches at Kennington and the new Northern Line Extension from Kennington to Battersea Power Station.

Customers can also take the first train available and change at Kennington, if needed.

Getting out and about

THERE'S lots going on in London this weekend. See below for some of the hottest happenings and details of how to get there.



Arch-itecture: Open House 2018 FRENCH & TYE

OPEN HOUSE LONDON

The world's largest architectural festival, Open House London gives free public access to more than 800 buildings across the capital. There are lots of talks, walks and tours to choose from, with locations ranging from the ancient Billingsgate Roman House and Baths to Southwark's contemporary City Hall and Valetta House, Ealing (above).

Getting there: Open House events take place at locations across the capital. For a smooth journey, plan your travel ahead by visiting tfl.gov.uk/plan-a-journey

CITY OF WOMEN

Visit Leadenhall Market to enjoy an exciting new audio composition celebrating London's women in their own words. From 11am until 2pm on Saturday and Sunday, there will be free performances on the hour, by an all-women cast of soloists and a choir. Expect themes such as freedom, women's rights and history, all explored through music.

Getting there: Leadenhall Market is a four-minute walk from Monument (Circle and District lines), a six-minute walk from Bank (Central and Northern lines) and an eight-minute walk from Aldgate (Circle and Metropolitan lines). A number of buses stop nearby.

HARVEST STOMP

Usher in autumn with an afternoon of free fun on Sunday, at Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park. Visitors of all ages can get stuck in from midday with arts and crafts, traditional garden games and an interactive mobile farm. There will also be live music and dance to tap your toes to, and world food stalls if you get peckish.

Getting there: The nearest station is Stratford (Central and Jubilee lines, DLR, London Overground, TfL Rail and National Rail). A number of buses stop nearby and there are Santander Cycles docking stations at eight different locations in the park.
