

Deadline extended for Oxford Street plans

Extra time to have your say on plans to transform the area.



LONDONERS now have until January 3, 2018 to comment on plans to transform Oxford Street and its district into an unrivalled place to live, work and visit.

The proposals could see a new traffic-free area developed between Orchard Street and Oxford Circus. By December 2018 this would create safe, accessible public spaces, alongside improved pedestrian crossings, wider pavements and additional taxi ranks on surrounding roads.

The residents, families and communities around Oxford Street are at the heart of these improvements that will address some of the pressing issues of poor road safety and air quality. The plans have also been designed to prepare for the increase in pedestrians visiting the area when Elizabeth line services begin in 2018.
