

Plan ahead for the weekend

EVERYONE TRAVELLING ON PUBLIC TRANSPORT MUST WEAR A FACE COVERING

District line

Sunday: No service between Turnham Green and Richmond. Use alternative local or replacement bus services. Rail replacement buses will run between Richmond and Acton Central.

Jubilee line

All weekend: No service between Waterloo and Stanmore. Use alternative Tube or local bus services. Rail replacement buses will run between Stonebridge Park (Bakerloo line) and Stanmore, and between Baker Street and Wembley Park.

Metropolitan line

All weekend: No service between Harrow-on-the-Hill and Aldgate. Use alternative Tube or local bus services. Rail replacement bus service ML1 will run between Harrow-on-the-Hill and Stonebridge Park via Wembley Park.

London Overground

All weekend: No service between Romford and Upminster. Use local bus services 165, 248 or 370.

Sunday: No service between Sydenham and Crystal Palace. Use local buses between Anerley and Crystal Palace. Trains from Highbury & Islington to Crystal Palace will divert to and from West Croydon until midday. After midday, they will stop at and run from New Cross Gate.

Sunday: No service between Kilburn High Road and Euston until midday and after 8.15pm. Use alternative Tube or local bus routes.

Sunday: No service between Richmond and South Acton. Rail replacement bus service DL3 will run between Richmond and Acton Central.

TfL Rail

All weekend: No service between Liverpool Street and Shenfield. Tickets will be accepted on bus route 25 between Stratford and Ilford. Rail replacement buses will run between Stratford and Romford, and between Newbury Park and Shenfield.

Sunday: No service between Paddington and Slough or Heathrow Terminal 5 until 8.50am. Customers for Heathrow from central London should use the Piccadilly line. Customers for Heathrow from Southall should use local bus route 105, and customers for Heathrow from Hayes & Harlington should use local bus route 140. Great Western Railway replacement buses will run from Paddington to Slough.



Reduced night services

THIS weekend, there is no Night Tube or Night Overground service, and limited Night Bus services are running. This includes tonight's night services.

Staying safe when travelling

NATIONAL restrictions to combat the spread of the coronavirus mean everyone must stay at home unless they have a reasonable excuse. Public transport can still be used for such journeys. Londoners should consider using the city's network of safe walking or cycling routes instead.

Customers should use TfL's travel tools to plan journeys by public transport during the quieter times. These are between 8.15am and 4pm and after 5.30pm on weekdays, and before midday and after 6pm on weekends.

Hospital-grade cleaning substances are being used on trains, trams, buses and at stations, and customers should carry hand sanitiser with them so they can clean their hands before and after their journey.

Extensive signage is in place, reminding customers to maintain social distancing. TfL's enforcement officers and the police are enforcing the requirement for everyone to wear a face covering over their nose and mouth while in a station or travelling on public transport, unless they are exempt.
