District line

All weekend: No service between Earl's Court and Richmond/Ealing Broadway. Use Central line services for Ealing Broadway. Rail replacement bus services will run.

Piccadilly line

All weekend: No service between King's Cross St Pancras and Northfields/Uxbridge. Use alternative Tube or local bus services. Rail replacement bus services will run.

London Overground

Saturday: No westbound service between Stratford and South Acton after 11.30pm. Use local bus services.

All weekend: No service between South Acton and Richmond. Rail replacement bus services will run.

All weekend: No service between Romford and Upminster. Use local bus services.

Sunday: No westbound service between Stratford and Willesden Junction after 10.45pm. Use local bus services.

Sunday: No service between South Tottenham and Barking until 2.45pm. Use Tube services between Seven Sisters and Walthamstow Central, and between East Ham and Barking. Use local bus services between South Tottenham and Walthamstow Queens Road. Rail replacement bus services will run between Walthamstow Central and Barking.

Sunday: No service between Kilburn High Road and Euston until 7.45am. Use alternative Tube or local bus services.

TfL Rail

All weekend: No service between Liverpool Street and Shenfield. Tickets will be accepted on bus route 25 between Stratford and Ilford. Rail replacement bus services will run.

All weekend: Reduced service between Paddington and Hayes & Harlington from 9pm on Saturday and all day on Sunday.

All weekend: Trains will not stop at Acton Main Line, West Ealing or Hanwell after 9pm on Saturday and all day on Sunday. Use alternative Tube or local bus services.

No Southern rail services from Victoria

EACH weekend in May, as well as Monday 31 May, there will be no Southern rail services to or from Victoria, owing to Network Rail work. Use alternative rail services from London Bridge for all destinations on these routes, including Gatwick Airport and Brighton.

Southern tickets will be accepted on the Tube between Victoria and Blackfriars/London Bridge/Balham. Rail replacement buses will run between East Croydon and Clapham Junction. Southeastern services are operating from Victoria as usual.

Ready when you are

AS more customers return to the transport network, TfL is reminding people of the latest advice to stay safe while travelling.

A near-normal service continues to run across the network, and customers are encouraged to travel during the quieter times to help make social distancing easier. These are between 8.15am and 4pm and after 5.30pm in the week, and before midday and after 6pm at weekends. The latest information is available online and through the TfL Go app.

Hospital-grade cleaning substances are being used across the network, and independent testing has been carried out monthly, with no traces of coronavirus being found. More than 1,000 free hand sanitising points are available to customers, and 200 UV light devices are continually sanitising escalator handrails.

TfL's enforcement officers and the police are enforcing the requirement for everyone

to wear a face covering over their nose and mouth while in a station or travelling on public transport, unless they are exempt.
