## EXPLORE LONDON'S CHRISTMAS MARKETS

IT'S getting darker earlier, so we're snuggling up by the fire and hunkering down for the winter. To get you into the festive spirit, pop on your winter woolies and head out to London's Christmas markets, where there's something for everyone.

### WINTER WONDERLAND

Stroll through the heart of Hyde Park and take in the atmosphere of one of the biggest Christmas markets in London. There's an ice rink, rides, food and lots more exciting activities for all ages.

Winter Wonderland runs until January 2, from 10am to 10pm. Book your tickets in advance to avoid missing out on the fun and festivity!

**Nearest stations:** Green Park (Jubilee, Piccadilly and Victoria lines), Paddington (Bakerloo, Circle, District, Hammersmith & City lines, Elizabeth line, and national rail) and Victoria (Circle, District and Victoria lines, and national rail) stations. Several buses also stop close to the park.

### PATERNOSTER SQUARE

Want to try something new? Soak up the seasonal spirit and wonderful views at Paternoster Square Christmas Market. It is one of the newer Christmas markets in the capital, located right by St Paul's Cathedral.

Explore the traditionally decorated cabins, enjoy an array of food, drinks, arts and crafts and see the Christmas tree twinkle. The market runs until December 23 from 10am to 7pm, Monday to Friday. You can read more at [tudormarkets.com](http://tudormarkets.com)

Afterwards, why not pop across the river to the Tate Modern or listen to some seasonal performances in the cathedral to get you even more into the Christmas spirit?

**Nearest stations:** Blackfriars (Circle and District lines, and national rail), Farringdon (Circle, Hammersmith & City and Metropolitan lines, Elizabeth line, and national rail), Barbican (Circle, Hammersmith & City and Metropolitan lines) and St Paul's (Central line) are a short walk away. Many buses also stop nearby.

### CHRISTMAS UNDER THE CANOPY

Whether you're jumping on a train to spend Christmas with loved ones or it's rainy outside, why not stop by Christmas under the Canopy at King's Cross?

You can pick up some last-minute Christmas gifts for family and friends or enjoy the independent food and crafts, carols, live music and more. This covered market is open from Tuesday to Sunday until December 22. You can discover more at [kingscross.co.uk/event](http://kingscross.co.uk/event)

**Nearest stations:** King's Cross station (Circle, Hammersmith & City, Metropolitan, Northern, Piccadilly and Victoria lines, and national rail) is a short walk away.

### THE SOUTHBANK WINTER MARKET

A walk along the South Bank is one of London's best free attractions.

From 11am every day until December 26, stroll along beside the Thames, with the area transformed into a market brimming over with traditional huts selling Christmas favourites, from trinkets and gifts to seasonal food and drinks. It's also free – what more could you want?

### SOUTHBANK CENTRE WINTER FESTIVAL

Nearby, the Southbank Centre is also hosting a Winter Festival until January 8. This includes the Southbank Winter Market and pop-ups, performances, arts and exhibitions, comedy shows, classical music performances and much more. Some of the events are free to attend.
