IMPROVEMENTS UNDER WAY

There are no planned works on the Bakerloo, Central, Hammersmith & City, Jubilee, Metropolitan, Northern, Piccadilly, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines. However, the following lines will be affected by engineering and improvement works.

Circle line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Aldgate and Gloucester Road (via Embankment) owing to station improvement work at Victoria and Sloane Square, and track and drainage work at Sloane Square. Use alternative Tube and/or bus services.

District line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Aldgate East and South Kensington owing to station improvement work at Victoria and Sloane Square, and track and drainage work at Sloane Square. Use alternative Tube and/or bus services.

London Overground

Part closure

Sunday: no service between Wandsworth Road and Clapham Junction owing to Network Rail track work. Trains will run along an alternative route to/from Battersea Park, instead of Clapham Junction. Use local buses via all reasonable routes between Clapham Junction and Battersea Park/Surrey Quays. Use Southern services between Battersea Park and Clapham Junction.

Sunday: No service between Gospel Oak and Barking owing to Network Rail track work. Replacement bus services will run. Go to tfl.gov.uk for full details.

Docklands Light Railway

Part closure

All weekend: No service between Blackwall and Beckton owing to track work. Replacement bus services will run:

Service A: Canning Town – Beckton (this service will not stop at Custom House or Royal Victoria – use bus service E)

Service E: Canning Town – ExCeL (via Emirates Royal Docks)

Service B Canary Wharf – Blackwall – East India – Canning Town – Custom House – Prince Regent

London Trams

Part closure

10pm Saturday-10am Sunday: No service between Reeves Corner and East Croydon owing to town centre improvement work. Trams from Beckenham Junction, Elmers End and New Addington will terminate at East Croydon. Trams from Wimbledon will terminate at Reeves Corner. Line 4 will not run. Bus route 410 links East Croydon and Reeves Corner, but passengers may find it quicker to walk between the two stops.


London Overground service changes next week

BETWEEN Monday and Thursday next week, there will be no London Overground service between Hackney Downs and Chingford after 10.30pm owing to Network Rail track work. Replacement buses will call at: Hackney Downs – Clapton – St. James Street – Walthamstow Central – Wood Street – Highams Park – Chingford.

Working towards a better Tube

LAST weekend was one of the busiest ever for track and drainage renewal as part of work to improve the Underground network:

- More than 220metres of drainage were replaced and improved at Temple
- Line improvement work took place at Westminster, with the installation of 600metres of new conductor rail
- On the Wimbledon branch of the District line, 315metres of track were replaced at Putney Bridge and 164metres of track at Wimbledon
- More than 390metres of drainage were improved between West Brompton and Fulham Broadway



- On the Circle and District line platforms at Victoria station, cabling was installed, walls and floors were retiled, and ceiling work was carried out. Platform walls were also retiled at Sloane Square

London ready for the Rugby World Cup

WITH just three months to go until the Rugby World Cup 2015 kicks off, the capital's transport chiefs have met to confirm plans for travel during the event.

In a meeting chaired by TfL, representatives from tournament organisers England Rugby 2015, the London boroughs and police discussed the preparations for hosting one of the world's most popular sporting competitions.

Between Friday September 18 and Saturday October 31, there

will be 17 matches across three London venues – Wembley Stadium, Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park and Twickenham Stadium, the home of English Rugby. More than one million spectators are expected in the capital over the six-week tournament.

Weekend events that may affect travel

Demonstration in central London: there will be significant disruption to buses in central London tomorrow between 11am and 6pm (Queen Victoria Street to Parliament Square) owing to a demonstration. On the Tube, Bank station (including the lifts to/from DLR) is likely to close to prevent overcrowding. The nearest accessible Tube station is London Bridge. Please note that there is a lift service to/from the Northern line platforms only, but owing to improvement works there won't be a lift service to/from the Jubilee line platforms. At Cannon Street, there is step-free access to/from the Network Rail platforms. However, there is no Tube service to/from Cannon Street tomorrow. The Central, Northern, Bakerloo and Jubilee lines are likely to be affected, and Bank, St. Paul's, Charing Cross,

Embankment and Westminster Tube stations are likely to be busier during this time and may need to close to prevent overcrowding. Please note that there is no District or Circle line service between South Kensington and Aldgate/Aldgate East.

British Summer Time Festival at Hyde Park: Hyde Park and nearby stations will be busier than usual on Saturday. The Piccadilly, Jubilee, Victoria and Central lines are likely to be busier than usual from around midday.

West End Live shows in the Square: stations near to Trafalgar Square will be busier than usual on Saturday and Sunday. The Northern and Bakerloo lines are also likely to be busy from around 11am until 6pm on both days.
