

Plan ahead for the weekend

Bakerloo line

All weekend: No service between Queen's Park and Harrow & Wealdstone. Rail replacement bus services will run via North Acton and Willesden Junction.

District line

All weekend: No service between Tower Hill and West Ham. Use alternative Tube or local bus services. Rail replacement bus services will run between Tower Hill and Barking via Canning Town.

Hammersmith & City line

All weekend: No service on the entire line. Use alternative Tube or local bus services. Rail replacement bus services will run between Tower Hill and Barking via Canning Town.

London Overground

Saturday: Trains will run a reduced service every 30 minutes between Gospel Oak and Barking after 9pm.

Sunday: No service between South Tottenham and Barking until 2.30pm. Use alternative Tube services between Seven Sisters and Walthamstow Central, and between East Ham and Barking. Use local bus services between South Tottenham and Walthamstow Queen's Road. Rail replacement bus services will run between Walthamstow Central and Barking.

All weekend: No service between Highbury & Islington and Shadwell, and between Surrey Quays and New Cross. Between Highbury & Islington and Dalston Kingsland, use alternative London Overground or local bus services. For New Cross, use London Overground services to New Cross Gate, then walk or use local bus services. Rail replacement bus services will run between Dalston Kingsland and Shadwell.

All weekend: No service between Watford Junction and Euston. Use alternative Tube or local bus services. Rail replacement bus services will run.

All weekend: No service between Romford and Upminster. Use local bus services.

All weekend: No service between Liverpool Street and Enfield Town. Use alternative Tube services or local bus services. Rail replacement bus services will run between Seven Sisters and Enfield Town.

All weekend: No service between Liverpool Street and Cheshunt via Seven Sisters. Instead use Greater Anglia services. Rail replacement bus services will run between Seven Sisters and Cheshunt.

All weekend: No service between Liverpool Street and Chingford. Use alternative Tube services. Rail replacement bus services will run between Hackney Downs and Chingford.

TfL Rail

All weekend: No service between Liverpool Street and Shenfield. Rail replacement bus services will run.

All weekend: A reduced service will run between Paddington and Hayes & Harlington from 9pm on Saturday and all day on Sunday, and trains will not call at Acton Main Line, Hanwell and West Ealing. Use local bus services.



Reduced night services

THIS weekend, there is no Night Tube or Night Overground service, and limited Night Bus services are running. This includes tonight's night services.

Staying safe when travelling

NATIONAL restrictions to combat the spread of coronavirus mean everyone must stay at home unless they have a reasonable excuse. Public transport can still be used for such journeys. Londoners should consider using the city's network of safe walking or cycling routes instead.

Customers should use TfL's travel tools, such as the TfL Go app and online journey planner, to plan journeys by public transport during the quieter times. These are between 8.15am and 4pm and after 5.30pm on weekdays, and before midday and after 6pm on weekends. For more detailed information, visit tfl.gov.uk/travel-tools

Pedal power: Push off into the weekend in style with a bike ride in your local area

DID you know that there are now more than 800 Santander Cycles docking stations across London?

There's no need to book in advance – just hire a bike, ride where you like and return it to any docking station across the capital. You'll have money to spare for a relaxing cuppa, too, with prices starting from as little as £2 a day for an unlimited number of 30-minute journeys.

You can also download the Santander Cycles app, which sends a release code straight to your phone, letting you skip past the terminal and get on your bike quicker.

TfL also funds free cycle training for all abilities, perfect for those who are new to cycling or would like to build more skills and boost their confidence.
