IMPROVEMENTS UNDER WAY

There are no planned works on the Bakerloo, Central, Circle, Hammersmith & City, Northern, Piccadilly, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines, Docklands Light Railway or London Tramlink. However, the following lines will be affected by engineering and improvement works.

District line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Turnham Green and Richmond owing to track improvements at Gunnersbury. Replacement buses will call at: Turnham Green – Gunnersbury – Royal Botanical Gardens (Victoria Gate) – Richmond.

Jubilee line

Part closure

Saturday: no service between Waterloo and Wembley Park while tunnel lining is replaced at Bond Street, points replaced at Neasden, and track work is carried out at Finchley Road. Replacement bus services will run:

Service C: Wembley Park – Stonebridge Park (for the Bakerloo line and London Overground)

Service D: Wembley Park – Neasden – Dollis Hill – Willesden Green – Kilburn – West Hampstead – Finchley Road – Swiss Cottage – St John's Wood – Baker Street

Sunday: Saturday's closure will extend to Stanmore. Service C: Stanmore – Canons Park – Queensbury – Kingsbury – Wembley Park – Stonebridge Park (for the Bakerloo line and London Overground services)

Metropolitan line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Aldgate and Harrow-on-the-Hill while points are replaced at Neasden and track work is carried out at Finchley Road. Additional Chiltern Railways trains will run between Marylebone and Harrow-on-the-Hill.

Replacement buses will run:

Service A: Wembley Park – Preston Road – Kenton (for the Bakerloo line and London Overground services) – Northwick Park – Harrow-on-the-Hill

London Overground

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Richmond and Willesden Junction while work takes place to prepare the network for five-car trains. Replacement buses will run.

All weekend: no service between Gospel Oak and Stratford while work takes place to prepare the network for five-car trains. Replacement buses will run.

All weekend: no service between New Cross Gate/Crystal Palace and West Croydon owing to Network Rail track work and TfL station work at Crystal Palace. Replacement buses will run.

Sunday: no service between Clapham Junction and Willesden Junction owing to Network Rail track work. Use local buses via all reasonable routes.

Sunday: no service between Highbury & Islington and Dalston Junction owing to Network Rail emergency bridge works at Highbury Corner. Replacement buses will run.

Check before you travel ahead of tomorrow's strike

PASSENGERS travelling tomorrow night are being asked to plan ahead should strike action threatened by the RMT Union go ahead.

TfL says the strike, which would last from 9.30pm tomorrow until 3.59am on Sunday, is expected to have minimal impact, although there is a chance of disruption on some Tube lines. The DLR, London Overground, buses and National Rail will not be affected.

The industrial action is the latest in a series of strikes called by the RMT after one of its members lost their job after failing two alcohol breath tests.

London Underground's chief operating officer Nick Brown said: 'You wouldn't let someone who had been drinking alcohol drive your family in a car, and we don't let people who have been drinking alcohol drive people's families in Tube trains.'

'Less than a quarter of the RMT members eligible to vote for strike action did so. For the RMT leadership to announce a strike regardless shows how completely out of touch they are, just as the timing demonstrates that they know they have very little support from



their members on this issue.

'Should they go through with this action it will achieve nothing and we'll work to ensure Londoners are kept informed and can still get around.'
