### Wembley Stadium

**Tonight, 5pm until midnight**

Tottenham welcome Juventus for the second leg of their Champions League clash tonight (kick-off 7.45pm). Large numbers of pedestrians and increased traffic are expected around the stadium before and after the game. Roads likely to be affected include the A406, A1, A40 and Harrow Road.

### Cornhill

**Tonight, 10pm until Friday, 5am**

The road will be closed eastbound between Bank Junction and the A10 Gracechurch Street each night for Bank station upgrade work.

### Russell Square

**Thursday, 11.30am until 5pm**

The road will be closed in all directions for a demonstration.

### Westminster area

**Saturday, midday until 3.30pm**

There will be closures in the area for a march from Duke Street to Trafalgar Square. Roads affected include Oxford Street eastbound, Regent Street, Piccadilly Circus, Haymarket and Pall Mall East.

### Piccadilly

**Sunday, midday to 5pm**

The road will be closed in all directions at the junction of Brick Street for a demonstration, which will move to Old Palace Yard.
