Jubilee line

All weekend: No service between Waterloo and Stanmore, including Night Tube services. Use alternative Tube services or rail replacement buses. Bus route N98 will run from/to Oxford Circus/Tottenham Court Road during the night.

Metropolitan line

All weekend: No service between Aldgate and Harrow-on-the-Hill. Use alternative Tube, Chiltern Rail or rail replacement bus services.

DLR

All weekend: No service between Bank/Tower Gateway and Canning Town/Canary Wharf, and between Stratford and Canary Wharf via All Saints. A rail replacement bus service will run.

London Overground

Sunday: No service between Liverpool Street and Chingford until 8.45am. Use alternative rail, Tube or local bus services.

Sunday: No service between Surrey Quays and Clapham Junction. A rail replacement bus service will run.

Sunday: No service between Gospel Oak and Barking. Use alternative Tube, local or rail replacement bus services.

Sunday: No service between Hackney Downs and Enfield Town/Cheshunt. Use alternative Tube, Greater Anglia, local or rail replacement bus services.

Sunday: No service between Willesden Junction and Richmond. Use alternative Tube or rail replacement bus services.

Keep travelling safely

CUSTOMERS are reminded that TFL continues to operate a safe, clean and reliable service, with regular cleaning regimes across the network.

TfL is encouraging customers and staff to take appropriate action to keep themselves safe – including using hand sanitiser and wearing a face covering if this helps them travel with confidence.

To help spread demand, passengers are encouraged to make journeys at quieter times. For Tube and rail, these are between 8.45am and 4.30pm and after 6.45pm in the week, and before midday and after 6.45pm at weekends.

The quieter times for buses are between 8.30am and 3pm and after 5.30pm in the week, and before 11.30am and after 5.30pm at weekends.

In this hot weather, TfL is also reminding customers to carry water with them when travelling on London's public transport, to help ensure everyone stays hydrated and travels safely, especially on the Tube. If wearing a face covering, passengers should be aware of others around them before removing it.

A new entrance at Hackney Central station has opened

CUSTOMERS can now enjoy quicker and easier access to London Overground services at Hackney Central, as a new entrance has opened on Graham Road. This will help to ease congestion, provide more direct access to the town centre and enable a simpler interchange with Hackney Downs station and local bus services.

The new second entrance provides major improvements to the station including a covered gate line, two new ticket vending machines and additional cycle storage helping to encourage greener and more sustainable journeys to and from the station. It also features a living roof, a green wall and new trees around the customer area. The latest energy saving LED technology is used throughout the station, providing a brighter and safer environment for customers.

This new southern entrance has direct access to the westbound platform and more direct walking access to the town centre with a convenient interchange to local bus stops on Graham Road. An information screen next to the station exit provides live next bus information, while a newly

installed pedestrian crossing makes it safer to cross the road to access buses heading towards Dalston.

The £3million scheme was created collaboratively with funding by the Department for Transport, using land that Hackney Council owns, and was delivered by Arriva Rail London, who operate London Overground services on TfL's behalf, and Network Rail.

Planned Night Tube strike

CUSTOMERS are encouraged to check their travel and to plan ahead of ongoing planned strike action every Friday and Saturday night on the Central, Jubilee, Northern and Victoria lines from 7pm. The planned action has now been extended to December 4. Customers are advised there is no service on the Jubilee line between Waterloo and

Stanmore this weekend and should make alternative travel plans – see box top left.
