

# Plan ahead for the weekend

## District line

**All weekend:** No service between Earl's Court and Richmond/Ealing Broadway. Use alternative Tube, local or rail replacement bus services.

## Piccadilly line

**All weekend:** No service between King's Cross St Pancras and Northfields/Uxbridge. Use alternative Tube, TfL Rail or rail replacement bus services.

## London Overground

**Sunday:** No service between Gospel Oak and Barking. Use alternative Tube, local or rail replacement bus services.

## TfL Rail

**Sunday:** Reduced service between Liverpool Street and Gidea Park from 11.30am until 10pm. Trains will run every 15 minutes.

## London Trams

**All weekend:** No service between Reeves Corner and Beckenham Junction, or Elmers End and New Addington in both directions from 10pm on Saturday until 8am on Sunday. Use local bus services.

## Northern line closure

CUSTOMERS are reminded that the Bank branch of the Northern line is closed between Kennington and Moorgate until mid-May 2022. This is owing to works to substantially increase the capacity at Bank station.

During this time, many stations and lines in central London will be much busier and customers are advised to consider new routes. There is an enhanced service running on the Charing Cross branch of the Northern line during peak periods, with a train at least every two minutes.

There is also a new bus route, the 733 from Oval to Moorgate, Finsbury Square, on weekdays. It will run every seven to eight minutes to help affected customers reach their destinations.

## Planned Night Tube strike

CUSTOMERS on the Tube are encouraged to check their travel and to plan their journeys ahead of ongoing planned strike action every Friday and Saturday night on the Central and Victoria lines from 7pm onwards, until June 19.

Normal Night Tube services are currently expected to run on the Victoria line, while the Central line will run a regular service through central London, with at least two trains per hour.

Customers are advised to check before they travel and use buses to complete their

journeys where required. Night services on London Overground will run as planned on Friday and Saturday nights between Highbury & Islington and New Cross Gate.

All other Tube lines will run their normal daytime services during these strikes, with the last Tubes in central London leaving at around 1am and starting again at 5.30am. Services from 7pm may be busier than normal as customers seek alternative routes for their journeys.

## Wear a face covering

CUSTOMERS are reminded that they must continue to wear a face covering over their nose and mouth while travelling on TfL services, unless they are exempt.

Passengers are encouraged to make journeys at quieter times to help spread demand across the day. The quieter times for the Tube and rail are between 8.45am and 4.30pm and after 6.45pm in the week, and before midday and after 6.45pm at weekends.

The quieter times for buses are between 8.30am and 3pm and after 5.30pm in the week, and before 11.30am and after 5.30pm at weekends.

## Going through Victoria?

THIS weekend, there will be no Southern rail or Gatwick Express services to or from Victoria, owing to Network Rail work. For East Croydon and stations between Gatwick Airport and Brighton, use Thameslink services from Blackfriars. Use Southern rail services from London Bridge for other destinations.

Thameslink and Southern tickets will be accepted on the Tube between Victoria and Blackfriars/London Bridge/Balham. There is no Northern line service through London Bridge until mid-May, so use alternative Tube, rail or local bus services.

Rail replacement buses will be running. Southeastern services will be operating from Victoria as usual.
