

# Strike information

**CUSTOMERS** are urged to check before they travel and leave plenty of time for their journey while the RMT and TSSA strike continues.

TfL aims to keep as many stations open and run as many trains as possible, with a reduced service operating on most lines. All Tube services will start later and finish earlier than normal – from around 7am to 11pm. Some stations will be closed.

All transport services are expected to be busier than normal. Services will return to normal by Friday morning.



## Buses

An extra 100 buses will run on key routes. Travel Ambassadors will be on-hand to provide travel advice and information at bus stations.

## DLR

A normal service will operate. Stations

where there is an interchange with London Underground may be affected.

## London Overground

A normal service will operate. Some stations where there is an interchange with London Underground may be affected.

## Tramlink

A normal service will operate.

## Emirates Air Line

A normal service will operate. Tube tickets will be accepted on Emirates Air Line services today and tomorrow.

## Cycling

Demand is likely to be high, and cycles harder to access, during peak times.

## River Services

Enhanced river services will be in place, visit [tfl.gov.uk](http://tfl.gov.uk) for details.

## Taxis & Private Hire

A marshalled taxi service will

operate at Waterloo, Liverpool Street, London Bridge, King's Cross, Victoria, Charing Cross, and Marylebone stations between 7am and 11am and between 7pm and midnight.

## Walking

Walking maps will be provided online, at buses, rail and Tube stations and other main outer London stations. TfL

Ambassadors and volunteers will be on-hand to help people plan their routes around the city.

## Roads

The Congestion Charge will remain in operation throughout the strike.

## Access all areas

TfL HAS announced that the accessibility of the transport network will be improved, making journeys easier for millions of disabled and older Londoners.

The programme of work, outlined in TfL's Your Accessible Transport Network action plan, means there will be more staff available in ticket halls and on platforms to help customers buy the right ticket, plan journeys and keep them safe.

On the Tube alone the number of journeys made on step-free routes each year will almost treble, from 67 million at present to 189 million in 2021.

There will also be an extension of the successful 'turn-up-and-go' assistance service when it is rolled-out to London Overground services this spring. This means that passengers who need staff assistance, for example disabled and visually impaired people, will no longer need to

book in advance. As with the Underground, all Overground stations will be staffed when services are running – with staff visible in public areas of the stations. There will also be improved ticket machines, able to fulfil functions currently only possible within ticket offices, and easier ways to pay for travel, including contactless bank card payment.

TfL's commitments mirror the main tenets of TSSA's 'Better London Transport' campaign and Passenger Charter, which calls for:

- An assurance for disabled passengers that they can turn up at any accessible station and be able to use the Tube
- A friendly face and a helping hand: a visible staff presence throughout all stations
- Well-maintained, safe and secure stations
- Clear communication and updates

## Traffic information for the capital

### Parliament Square

**Feb 8, 11am to 6pm**

A large group is expected to travel along the London Underground Circle line with final exit to Parliament Square. Abindgon Street will be closed from 3pm to 6pm for the event.

### Seven Sisters A503

**Feb 8, 8am to Feb 10, 11am**

Lane 3 at the junction with Isledon Road will be closed including a banned right turn into Isledon

Road for water mains works.

### New Bridge Street A201

**Feb 10, 8am to Feb 20, 7pm**

Lane two between Queen Victoria Street and Bridewell Place will be closed for BT works: Mon-Fri, 8am-7pm, Sat, 8am-5pm, Sun, 9am-5pm.

### Westminster Bridge A302

**Feb 7, midnight to Feb 10 midnight**

There will be lane restrictions in

place at the junction of Victoria Embankment A3211 during bridge repair works.

### Clapham Road A3

**February 11, 10am to February 14, 3.30pm**

There will be temporary signals at the junction of Caldwell Street for works on traffic signals.
