GOOD NEWS FOR NIGHT OWLS AS THE JUBILEE LINE NIGHT TUBE RETURNS ON FRIDAYS AND SATURDAYS FROM MAY 21

WITH the Platinum Jubilee bank holiday weekend on its way, the Queen's Silver Jubilee's namesake Night Tube service will return on Friday and Saturday evenings from Saturday May 21.

It follows a pause in Night Tube services during the pandemic, with the Central and Victoria line services returning in November last year.

Northern and Piccadilly line Night Tube services will also return later this summer, making it even easier to get out and enjoy the city.

SAFETY FIRST

The return of the Jubilee line Night Tube provides a further safe travel option for Londoners looking to make the most of all the capital has to offer at night, including the razzmatazz of the West End. Jubilee line services also connect with the Night Overground at Canada Water.

Even more Londoners are now taking advantage of the city's safe, clean and reliable public transport services. The Tube ridership is as high as 80 per cent of pre-pandemic levels at the weekends, while bus ridership is regularly hitting 75 per cent, which is another milestone in

London's recovery, and comes in perfect time for a jam-packed summer of fun and festivities.

The increased availability of Night Tube services will provide a much-appreciated boost for businesses and go a long way in seeing London's world-leading night-time economy thrive again.

ACROSS THE NETWORK

Currently, there is a normal service running on the Victoria line Night Tube each weekend, with a regular service on the Central line, and from Saturday, three-plus trains an hour on the Jubilee line Night Tube service – just in time for the Platinum Jubilee.

London is once again open for evening business, and there has never been a better time to experience the capital at night and get around safely and quickly.

Seb Dance, the deputy mayor for transport said: 'The return of the Jubilee line Night Tube marks another important moment in London's recovery from the pandemic. From this weekend, Night Tube services on the Jubilee line will join those already back open and running on the Victoria and Central

line. Combined with the return of the Piccadilly and Northern lines later this summer, this will make a huge difference to Londoners travelling around our city at night, offering them an additional safe and reliable routes – in perfect time for a jam-packed summer of fantastic events in the capital.'

The reinforced Night Tube service operates alongside the Night Overground as well as the extensive night bus network to ensure everyone can travel throughout the capital whatever the hour – on top of a 5.30am to 12.30am service.

More than 100 bus routes currently run through the night, and licensed taxis and private hire services provide door-to-door transport service when needed.

TfL is working to solve resourcing issues on the Northern and Piccadilly lines ahead of their return to Night Tube services in the coming months. Their return also has to be planned around vital operational and engineering closures.
