Find out about line closures and alternative travel options at tfl.gov.uk

There are no planned track works this Bank Holiday weekend on the Bakerloo, Central, Circle, District, Hammersmith & City, Jubilee, Metropolitan, Piccadilly, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines, DLR or London Trams. However, the following lines will be affected by engineering and improvement works.

Circle line Station closure

Sunday and Monday: Ladbroke Grove station closed for the Notting Hill Carnival.

Hammersmith & City line Station closure

Sunday and Monday: Ladbroke Grove station closed for the Notting Hill Carnival.

Northern line Part closure

Monday: no service between Hampstead and Edgware owing to track replacement work at Colindale. Replacement buses will run.

Service D: Canons Park (for the Jubilee line) – Edgware – Burnt Oak – Colindale – Hendon Central – Golders Green – Hampstead – Belsize Park – Chalk Farm

Service E: Hendon Central – Brent Cross – Golders Green – Hampstead – Belsize Park – Chalk Farm

London Overground Part closure

Saturday to Monday: no service between Gospel Oak and Barking owing to Network Rail preparing the track for new, longer trains. Replacement buses will run between Gospel Oak and Seven Sisters (for South Tottenham), and Walthamstow Central and Barking.

There will also be no service from South Tottenham to Barking between Tuesday and Friday next week.

Sunday (until 11.15am): no service between Clapham Junction and Willesden Junction owing to Network Rail track work. Use local buses via all reasonable routes.

TfL Rail Part closure


Sunday to Monday: no service between Liverpool Street and Stratford owing to Network Rail track improvement work. Use alternative Tube services.

Step-free access changes at West Ham

FROM Tuesday August 30 until late September, there will be no step-free access from the ticket hall to the DLR and Jubilee line at West Ham station while lifts are refurbished.

Customers should use alternative routes to access the local West Ham area and change between the Hammersmith & City/District/C2C rail services and the DLR/Jubilee line. Allow extra time for your journey.

One of the lifts will be back in service on Saturday September 3. This is to support the National Paralympic Day and Liberty Festival 2016 event at the Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park.



Carnival closures

THE Notting Hill Carnival is the largest festival celebration of its kind in Europe and takes place on Sunday and Monday.

As well as Ladbroke Grove station closing, there will be exit and entry restrictions at:

- Latimer Road – station closes at 11.30pm
- Royal Oak – exit-only between 11am and 6pm, when the station will close
- Westbourne Park – exit-only between 11am and 6pm, and the station will close at 11.30pm

- Notting Hill Gate – exit-only between 11am and 7pm, and no Circle or District line trains will stop at the station between these times. There will be no interchange between District/Circle and Central services

Advice for planned bus strike

PLANNED strike action could affect a number of bus services today and Monday.

If the strike goes ahead (check for latest news at tfl.gov.uk/bus-strike), it will likely result in severe disruption on a number of bus routes in east and west London, including some routes that run into central London. Some services may not run.

The action is the result of a dispute between Unite and Tower Transit over bus driver employment conditions.

Tower Transit operates less than five per cent

of the bus services in London – this equates to 20 day bus routes and eight night bus routes. Services operated by other companies across the capital are not affected and will run a normal service.
