

Plan your weekend travel

Find out about line closures and alternative travel options at tfl.gov.uk

With the exception of the Metropolitan line, there are no planned works on any Tube lines or on London Trams this weekend. Engineering and improvement works will affect the following services:

Metropolitan line

Part closure

Sunday: no service between Aldgate and Wembley Park before 9.30am and after 8.30pm owing to track and signalling replacement work between Baker Street and Finchley Road. Use the Jubilee line between Baker Street, Finchley Road and Wembley Park, and the Circle or Hammersmith & City lines between Aldgate and Baker Street.

London Overground

Part closure

Richmond/Clapham Junction to Stratford route

Sunday: no service between Camden Road and Stratford owing to bridge replacement work at Highbury Corner. Replacement buses will run.

Gospel Oak to Barking route

Until Sunday: no service between Gospel Oak and Barking owing to Network Rail work to enable new, longer trains to run from spring 2018. Replacement bus services will run:

- Gospel Oak - Upper Holloway - Crouch Hill - Finsbury Park (for the Piccadilly and Victoria lines)
- Haringay Green Lanes - Seven Sisters (for South Tottenham and the Victoria line)
- Walthamstow Central (for the Victoria line) - Leyton Midland Road - Leytonstone High Road
- Wanstead Park - Woodgrange Park - East Ham (for the District and Hammersmith & City lines)
- Barking

At East Ham, eastbound buses will be set down only and westbound buses will pick up only.

Use local buses between South Tottenham and Walthamstow Queen's Road or Tube services between Finsbury Park and Walthamstow Central, and between East Ham and Barking.

Highbury & Islington to New Cross/Clapham Junction/Crystal Palace/West Croydon route

Sunday: no service between Sydenham and Crystal Palace owing to Network Rail track work. Replacement buses will call at: Crystal Palace - Norwood Junction - West Croydon.

Liverpool Street to Enfield Town/Cheshunt (via Seven Sisters)/Chingford route

Sunday: trains to/from Chingford will not stop at Bethnal Green owing to Network Rail track work. Use Enfield Town/Cheshunt trains.

Romford to Upminster route

All weekend: no service between Romford and Upminster owing to Crossrail construction and Network Rail infrastructure work. Use local buses.

DLR

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Stratford and Bow Church owing to Crossrail work at Pudding Mill Lane. Use local buses.

TfL Rail

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Stratford and Shenfield owing to Network Rail track and station improvement work and Crossrail construction. Replacement buses will call at all stations except Maryland, as well as Newbury Park (for the Central line).


Overground service resumes Monday

TRAINS on the London Overground route between Gospel Oak and Barking will start running again from Monday, following a five-week closure.

Network Rail has been working on the line to prepare it for the new, longer trains, which will be introduced next spring. There will be another eight-week closure from

Saturday, November 18 when more work will be carried out.

A subterranean screening

DON'T miss the rare chance to watch a film in one of London's eight deep-level shelters at Clapham South Underground station.

From October 18 to 22, the shelter will host a screening of a bespoke Second World War film reel curated by London Transport Museum. Descend the 180 steps and cosy up underneath a blanket before learning about the realities of

being a Londoner during wartime.

Tickets cost £46.50 (concessions £41.50) from www.ltmuseum.co.uk/whats-on. The ticket includes a half-price day pass to London Transport Museum, which must be used within one month of your event date, and a ten per cent discount at the museum shop. Screenings last one hour.

TfL Rail improvements continue

WORK to upgrade stations and track on the TfL Rail route will continue this autumn to prepare the existing railway for when Elizabeth line services start in 2018.

From late October until December 2017, there will be weekend closures on the Liverpool Street to Shenfield route.

During this time, Network Rail will install more

than 10km of new overhead wires, connect the Elizabeth line's new central tunnels to the rest of the route and continue refurbishing Harold Wood, Gidea Park, Forest Gate and Goodmayes stations.

TfL will continue to fit new lifts at Seven Kings, Manor Park and Maryland stations to create step-free access. The closures will vary each weekend so customers should check before they travel at www.tfl.gov.uk.
