

Plan your weekend travel

Find out about line closures and alternative travel options at tfl.gov.uk

There are no planned works on the Bakerloo, Central, Jubilee, Metropolitan, Piccadilly, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines, TfL Rail or London Trams. However, the following lines will be affected by engineering and improvement works.

Circle line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Baker Street and Hammersmith/High Street Kensington owing to track replacement work at Paddington, Latimer Road and Edgware Road. Use other Tube services or local buses.

District line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Edgware Road and High Street Kensington owing to track replacement and station improvement work at Edgware Road. Use other Tube services or local buses.

All weekend: no service before 9.00am and after 9.00pm between Earl's Court and Kensington (Olympia). Use London Overground services from West Brompton, or local buses.

Hammersmith & City line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Baker Street and Hammersmith owing to track replacement work at Paddington, Latimer Road and Edgware Road. Use other Tube services or local buses.

Northern line

Part closure

All weekend: No service between Charing Cross/Moorgate and Morden on late Friday night/early Saturday morning (from 12.45am).

Please use rail replacement buses, local bus routes or alternative Tube or rail routes. This is in preparation for the Northern line extension.

Replacement buses will call at: Stockwell (for the Victoria line) - Clapham North - Clapham Common - Clapham South - Balham (for National Rail services to/from Victoria) - Tooting Bec - Tooting Broadway - Colliers Wood - South Wimbledon - Morden (for London Trams services to/from Wimbledon).

DLR

Part closure

Sunday: no service between Stratford and Bow Church owing to Crossrail works at Pudding Mill Lane. Use local buses.

London Overground

Part closure

Richmond/Clapham Junction to Stratford route

Sunday: no service after 10pm between Gospel Oak and Stratford owing to Network Rail track work. Use alternative London Overground trains between Highbury & Islington and Dalston Junction. Replacement buses will run between Hampstead Heath and Stratford.

Gospel Oak to Barking route

Until Sunday October 22: no service between Gospel Oak and Barking owing to Network Rail work to enable new, longer trains to run from spring 2018. Replacement bus services will run.

Gospel Oak - Upper Holloway - Crouch Hill - Finsbury Park (for the Piccadilly and Victoria lines) - Harringay Green Lanes - Seven Sisters (for South Tottenham and the Victoria line)

Walthamstow Central (for the Victoria line) - Leyton Midland Road - Leytonstone High Road - Wanstead Park - Woodgrange Park - East Ham (for the District and Hammersmith & City lines) - Barking

At East Ham, eastbound buses will set down only and westbound buses will pick up only.

Use local buses between South Tottenham and Walthamstow Queen's Road or Tube services between Finsbury Park and Walthamstow Central, and between East Ham and Barking.

Highbury & Islington to New Cross/Clapham Junction/ Crystal Palace/West Croydon route

Sunday: no service between New Cross Gate and Crystal Palace/West Croydon owing to Network Rail track work. Replacement buses will run.

Sunday: no service between Surrey Quays and Clapham Junction owing to Network Rail infrastructure work. Replacement buses will run between Canada Water and Clapham Junction.

Marble Arch escalator works

THERE will be no down escalator in use at Marble Arch station from Sunday while work takes place as part of TfL's plan to modernise the Tube.

With approximately 150 steps between the street and the platform, people travelling with luggage, buggies or who are unable to use the stairs are being advised to use Bond Street station instead, which is a seven-minute walk away. All buses from stop K on Oxford Street also go to Bond Street station. Customers using Marble Arch station are being advised to use the stairs safely, with a special campaign running along the escalator hoardings encouraging passengers to 'Hold the handrail'.

The maintenance work will ensure the escalator continues to offer a reliable service, with full escalator capacity available during the busy pre-Christmas shopping season. The work should be finished by mid-November.

NFL comes to the capital

THOUSANDS of American football fans are expected to flock to central London on Saturday afternoon for the annual NFL street party celebrations.

Regent Street will be closed to traffic as the colourful festival of football takes over the full length of the road from Piccadilly Circus to Oxford Circus with interactive games, on-stage performances and appearances, merchandise and much more.

The NFL on Regent Street event comes on the eve of the Wembley contest between the New Orleans Saints and Miami Dolphins, and one of the highlights of the day will be the arrival of coaches and players from the two teams.
