Bakerloo line

Saturday and Sunday: No service between Queen's Park and Harrow & Wealdstone. Rail replacement buses will run.

Monday: No service between Queen's Park and Harrow & Wealdstone until midday. Use London Overground services between Willesden Junction and Queen's Park/Euston. Rail replacement buses will also run.

District line

All bank holiday weekend: No service between Tower Hill and West Ham. Use alternative Tube or local bus services. Rail replacement buses will also run between Tower Hill and Barking via Canning Town.

Hammersmith & City line

All bank holiday weekend: No service on the entire line. Use alternative Tube or local bus services. Rail replacement buses will also run between Tower Hill and Barking via Canning Town.

Northern line

All bank holiday weekend: No service between Moorgate and Kennington. Use alternative Tube or local bus services.

DLR

All bank holiday weekend: No service between Poplar and Beckton. Rail replacement buses will run between Canary Wharf and Beckton.

London Overground

Saturday and Sunday: No service between Watford Junction and Euston. Use alternative Tube or local bus services. Rail replacement buses will run.

All bank holiday weekend: No service between Highbury & Islington and Shadwell. Use alternative London Overground services and local buses. Rail replacement buses will run between Dalston Kingsland/Junction and Shadwell.

All bank holiday weekend: No service between Surrey Quays and New Cross. Use London Overground services to New Cross Gate, then walk or use local buses.

All bank holiday weekend: No service between Romford and Upminster. Instead use local buses to make your journey.

Monday: No service between Watford Junction and Willesden Junction until midday. Use alternative Tube or local bus services. Rail replacement buses will run.

TfL Rail

All bank holiday weekend: No service between Liverpool Street and Shenfield. Tickets will be accepted on bus route 25 between Stratford and Ilford. Rail replacement buses will run.

Sunday: Reduced service between Paddington and Hayes & Harlington. Trains will not stop at Acton Main Line, West Ealing and Hanwell.

Reduced night services



THIS weekend, there are no Night Tube or Night Overground services. Most Tube services run until about 1am and Night Buses continue to run throughout the weekend across London.

Other transport options are available, such as taxis and private hire vehicles. Although black taxis can be hailed on the street, licensed private hire vehicles must be booked in advance and customers are advised only to use licensed vehicles.

No Southern rail services from Victoria

EACH weekend in May, including the public holidays, there will be no Southern rail services to or from Victoria, owing to Network Rail work. On these weekends, use alternative rail services from London Bridge for all destinations on these routes, including Gatwick Airport and Brighton.

Southern tickets will be accepted on the Tube between Victoria and Blackfriars/London Bridge/Balham. Replacement buses will run between East Croydon and Clapham Junction. Southeastern services are operating from Victoria as usual.

Ready when you are

WITH the further lifting of lockdown restrictions on April 12, TfL is reminding people of how to stay safe while travelling.

A near-normal service continues to run across the network, and customers are encouraged to travel during the quieter times to help make social distancing easier. These are between 8.15am and 4pm and after 5.30pm in the week, and before midday and after 6pm at weekends. The latest information is available online and through the TfL Go app.

Hospital-grade cleaning substances are being used across the network, and independent testing by Imperial College London has been carried out monthly since September 2020, with no traces of coronavirus being found.

In addition, more than 1,000 hand sanitising points are available across the network, and 200 UV light devices are continually sanitising escalator handrails.

TfL's enforcement officers and the police are enforcing the requirement for everyone to wear a face covering over their nose and mouth while in a station or travelling on public transport, unless they are exempt. For more, visit tfl.gov.uk/travel-tools
