Bakerloo line

Sunday: No service between Queen's Park and Harrow & Wealdstone, owing to engineering work. Rail replacement bus services BL1 and BL2 will run.

Circle line

All weekend: No service on the entire line owing to engineering work. Use alternative Tube and local bus services.

District line

All weekend: No service between South Kensington and East Ham, owing to engineering work. Rail replacement bus services DL6 and DL7 will run. Use alternative Tube, local and replacement bus routes.

Hammersmith & City line

All weekend: No service between Baker Street and Barking, owing to engineering work. Use alternative Tube and local or replacement bus services.

Metropolitan line

All weekend: No service between Baker Street and Aldgate, owing to engineering work. Use alternative Tube and local bus services.

London Overground

Saturday: No service between Kilburn High Road and Euston after 9.30pm, owing to engineering work. Use alternative Tube or local bus services.

Sunday: No service between Camden Road and Stratford after 9.45pm, owing to engineering work. Rail replacement bus service S will run.

Sunday: No service between Watford Junction and Euston, owing to engineering work. Rail replacement bus services will run. Use Tube and local buses between Euston and Queen's Park. Or use London Northwestern Railway services between Watford Junction and Euston.

All weekend: No service between Highbury & Islington and New Cross Gate, owing to engineering work. Rail replacement bus service X will run between Dalston Kingsland and New Cross Gate. Or use Tube, DLR or local bus services.

All weekend: No service between New Cross Gate and Crystal Palace or West Croydon, owing to engineering work. Use alternative Southern Rail services.

All weekend: No service between Surrey Quays and Clapham Junction, owing to engineering work. Rail replacement bus service M will run between Canada Water and Clapham Junction.

Going through Green Park?

OWING to the closures listed on the left, some lines and stations may be busier than usual this weekend. To maintain social distancing, avoid changing trains at Green Park station.

Stay safe when travelling

FACE coverings must be worn over your mouth and nose on public transport for the entire journey, unless you are exempt. This is to keep everyone safe. Carry sanitiser and wash your hands before and after you travel. During the hot weather, customers are also advised to carry water when travelling. If you need to drink water, please be mindful of other passengers near you and replace your

face covering as soon as possible. To plan your journey, download the new TfL Go travel app. View live train times, step-free options and walking or cycling routes. Marylebone station works

STARTING this month, two escalators serving the Bakerloo line are to be replaced, and a third escalator installed. Marylebone station

will remain open throughout these works, with two escalators in operation at all times.

The escalators are some of the oldest on the network, dating back to 1943 and, once complete, the improvements will increase capacity and reliability at this busy station. The work is scheduled to be completed by autumn 2023.
