

Plan ahead for the weekend

District Line

All weekend: No service between Earl's Court and Ealing Broadway/Richmond, owing to track replacement work. Rail replacement buses will run from Hammersmith.

Piccadilly line

Friday Night Tube: No service between Hyde Park Corner and Heathrow from 1.45am until 3.45am. From 3.45am there will be no service between Hammersmith and Heathrow. See blue box below for more details.

All weekend: No service between Hammersmith and Heathrow/Uxbridge, owing to track replacement work. See blue box below for more details.

London Overground

All weekend: No service between Gospel Oak and Barking, owing to Network Rail works. Rail replacement buses will run between Gospel Oak and Seven Sisters (for South Tottenham) and between Walthamstow Central and Barking. Use the Victoria line or local buses between Seven Sisters and Walthamstow Central.

Sunday: Trains to/from Chingford will not stop at Bethnal Green. Use Enfield Town/Cheshunt trains instead.

Sunday: No service between Liverpool Street and Enfield Town/Cheshunt (via Seven Sisters)/Chingford until 10.15am and after 9.45pm. Use alternative Tube and local bus routes between Liverpool Street and Seven Sisters. Rail replacement buses will run between Seven Sisters and Enfield Town/Cheshunt, and between Hackney Downs and Chingford.

TfL Rail

Sunday: Trains will not stop at Acton Main Line, Hanwell and West Ealing from 9pm on Saturday until midnight on Sunday, and there will be a reduced service between Paddington and Hayes & Harlington. This is owing to overhead wire upgrade work.

Sunday: No service between Liverpool Street and Ilford, owing to Crossrail train tests. Rail replacement buses will run.

Heading to Heathrow?

THERE will be no Piccadilly line service to or from Heathrow Airport on Saturday and Sunday. This is owing to track replacement work at Acton Town. The line will be closed all weekend between Hammersmith and Heathrow/Uxbridge.

Alternative options for travelling include non-stop coach services, which will operate regularly between Heathrow Terminals 2/3 and Hammersmith, as well as between Heathrow Terminal 5 and Hammersmith.

There will also be a stopping bus service between Heathrow Terminals 2/3 and

Hammersmith, calling at all intermediate stations. This service will extend to Terminal 5 during Night Tube hours. Porters will be available at Hammersmith and Heathrow terminals to help coach passengers with their luggage.

Wheelchair users and other passengers with mobility impairments travelling to Heathrow should go to Paddington station on the Hammersmith & City line for TfL Rail services, which will run every 30 minutes.

Getting there: The nearest Tube station is Peckham Rye (London Overground and National Rail), and a number of bus routes serve the area.

From crafting lanterns to creating funky patterns on their very own fan, this is a great option to keep them amused. Getting there: The nearest station is Cutty Sark for Maritime Greenwich (DLR). Alternatively, take the Thames Clipper service that stops at Greenwich Pier, just next to the Cutty Sark.
