

Plan ahead for the weekend

EVERYONE TRAVELLING ON PUBLIC TRANSPORT MUST WEAR A FACE COVERING

District line

All weekend: No service between Tower Hill and West Ham, owing to engineering work. Rail replacement bus service DL6 will run.

Hammersmith & City line

All weekend: No service between Hammersmith and Barking, owing to engineering work. Use alternative Tube and local or replacement bus services.

London Overground

All weekend: No service between Highbury & Islington and New Cross Gate, owing to engineering work. Rail replacement bus service X will run between Dalston Kingsland and New Cross Gate. Or use Tube, DLR or local bus services.

All weekend: No service between New Cross Gate and Crystal Palace or West Croydon, owing to engineering work. Use alternative Southern Rail services and local or replacement bus services.

All weekend: No service between Surrey Quays and Clapham Junction, owing to engineering work. Rail replacement bus service M will run between Canada Water and Clapham Junction.

All weekend: No service between Liverpool Street and Enfield Town, owing to engineering work. Use Tube or local bus services. Rail replacement bus service L1 will run between Seven Sisters and Enfield Town.

All weekend: No service between Liverpool Street and Cheshunt, owing to engineering work. Rail replacement bus service L2 will run between Seven Sisters and Cheshunt. Or use Greater Anglia services.

All weekend: No service between Liverpool Street and Chingford, owing to engineering work. Use Tube services instead. Rail replacement bus service L3 will run between Hackney Downs and Chingford.

Stay safe when travelling

IF you can travel another way, consider walking or cycling. Everyone who can work from home should continue to do so. If using public transport, be aware that you may be expected to queue to enter stations.

Face coverings must be worn over your mouth and nose on public transport for the entire journey. Always carry hand sanitiser and wash your hands before and after you travel, especially when social distancing.

During the hot weather, customers are also advised to carry water with them when travelling. If you need to take a drink out of your water bottle, please be mindful of other passengers near you and replace your face covering as soon as possible.

Try to travel outside peak times, including between 5.45am and 8.15am, and between 4pm and 5.30pm on weekdays. Check the busiest stations by visiting tfl.gov.uk

Remember to touch in on the Emirates Air Line

PASSENGERS for the Emirates Air Line must now touch in and out using a contactless device or Oyster card at the gates.

Owing to social distancing only one passenger is allowed per cabin, unless a household or group is travelling together.

The cable car service is open from 7am to 10pm Mondays to Fridays, from 8am to 10pm on Saturdays and bank holidays, and from 9am to 10pm on Sundays.

EATING OUT

This year, Underbelly is focusing on street food with its new StreetEat markets promising to bring together some of London's top independent traders in open-air settings.

The first site, near Gabriel's Wharf, on the South Bank, opened earlier this month and

will run through until October. The second site opens today at Wimbledon Park and will run until August 23.

Food traders already signed up include Lukumade Doughnut Tales, dishing up hot crispy Greek fried fodder, Kurbside Kitchen, with its gourmet hot dogs, and The London Grilled Fish Company, selling sumptuous seafood-filled baps.

The StreetEat sites will also host free live performances from musicians, DJs, cabaret stars and singers who are all living locally to the site.

OPEN GALLERY

It's really welcome news that both Tate Modern and Tate Britain have reopened to visitors. Both galleries offer visual feasts for art lovers with the Andy Warhol exhibition at Tate Modern now extended until November 15, while the Aubrey Beardsley retrospective at Tate Britain now runs until September 20.

Also extended at Tate Britain is Steve McQueen's free Year 3 exhibition, a photographic portrait of London's Year 3 classes, on until the end of January 2021.
