Closure of entrances at King's Cross St. Pancras

TWO entrances to King's Cross St. Pancras Tube station are now closed so work can continue to redevelop the area outside the National Rail station.

The main entrance on the north side of Euston Road is closed. At busy times, passengers for the Northern, Piccadilly or Victoria lines will be directed to enter via the rail station's northern ticket hall in the departures concourse. This route will be clearly signposted.

The south east entrance will also be available so passengers can reach the Circle, Hammersmith & City and Metropolitan line platforms.

The other closed entrance is on the south side of Euston Road, however, there is another entrance to the station on that road.

Northern line update

NEW signalling will be tested during a closure on the Northern line this weekend.

It is currently operating between West Finchley and High Barnet, and when fully rolled out across the line, trains will be able to run faster and closer together, boosting capacity by 20 per cent.

Northern line manager Pat Hansberry explained: 'We know it's not something you see or take much notice of, but new signalling will allow us to run more trains, more often, with fewer failures. By running them more quickly and closer together, it'll mean more room – or capacity – on the line. This is vital as nearly a million people ride the Northern line each day, and numbers are growing.'

'When the upgrade is complete in 2014,

the line capacity will increase by a fifth. This means we can carry the equivalent of an extra 11,000 passengers an hour. At the same time, journey times will be reduced by 18 per cent.'

Much of the preparatory work for the line's upgrade has already been done to replace a system that dates back to the 1950s; new trackside wiring and other equipment is now in place and all trains are ready for the new system. A huge amount of this work has been done at night to ensure passengers are affected as little as possible.

In addition to the signalling work, track and sleepers are also being replaced, which will result in smoother, quieter and more reliable journeys.

Travel advice for The Killers concert at Wembley Stadium

THE Killers concert at Wembley Stadium is due to finish at approximately 11pm tomorrow evening. Passengers are urged to allow plenty of time to get public transport home, especially if making

National Rail connections. A managed queuing system will be in place at all three Wembley stations after the event.

There are no planned works on the Bakerloo, Central, Circle, District, Hammersmith & City, Jubilee, Metropolitan, Northern, Piccadilly, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines, Docklands Light Railway or London Tramlink. However, the following lines will be affected by engineering and improvement works.

Bakerloo line

Station closure

Edgware Road: Closed until late December owing to lift replacement work. Edgware Road (Circle and Hammersmith & City lines) is the nearest alternative station. Trains from here connect with Bakerloo line services at Baker Street and Paddington.

Northern line

Part closure

Saturday: No service between Stockwell and Golders Green/High Barnet via Bank and Charing Cross owing to new signalling being tested and work to enlarge and rebuild Tottenham Court Road station. Replacement bus services will run:

Service A (Saturday only): Arnos Grove (for the Piccadilly line) – North Finchley (Tally Ho Corner) – Woodside Park – Totteridge & Whetstone – High Barnet

Service B: King's Cross St. Pancras – Camden Town – Kentish Town – Tufnell Park – Archway – Highgate – East Finchley – Finchley Central (calls at Finchley Central on Saturday only)

Service C (Saturday only): Arnos Grove (for the Piccadilly line) – North Finchley (Tally Ho Corner) – West Finchley – Finchley Central – Mill Hill East

Service E: Euston – Mornington Crescent – Camden Town – Chalk Farm – Belsize Park – Hampstead – Golders Green – Finchley Road (for the Jubilee line)

Service G: Elephant & Castle (for the Bakerloo line to/from central London) – Kennington – Oval – Stockwell (for the Victoria line to/from central London)

Sunday: No service between Stockwell and Golders Green/East Finchley via Bank and Charing Cross owing to new signalling being tested, and work to enlarge and rebuild Tottenham Court Road station. See above for replacement bus information.

Waterloo & City line

Enhanced service

Owing to the Northern line closures, the line will be open for longer than usual:

Saturday: 8am – 10pm (10 trains an hour)

Sunday: 10am – 8pm (10 trains an hour)

London Overground

Part closure

Sunday (until 9.15am): No service between Surrey Quays and Clapham Junction owing to track renewal work by Network Rail. Tickets will be accepted on buses via all reasonable routes.
