

Plan your weekend travel

Find out about line closures and alternative travel options at tfl.gov.uk

With the exception of the Metropolitan and Piccadilly lines, there are no planned works on any other Tube lines this weekend or on London Trams. Engineering and improvement works will affect the following services:

Metropolitan line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Harrow-on-the-Hill and Uxbridge owing to points being renewed at Rayners Lane. Use replacement buses.

Harrow-on-the-Hill – West Harrow – South Harrow – Rayners Lane – Eastcote – Ruislip Manor – Ruislip – West Ruislip (for Central line and Chiltern Railways) – Ickenham – Hillingdon – Uxbridge

Piccadilly line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between South Harrow and Uxbridge owing to points being renewed at Rayners Lane. Replacement buses will run. See Metropolitan line entry above.

London Overground

Part closure

Gospel Oak to Barking route

Until October 22: no service between Gospel Oak and Barking owing to continuing Network Rail works to enable new, longer trains to run from spring 2018. Replacement buses will run:

- Gospel Oak – Upper Holloway – Crouch Hill – Finsbury Park (for the Piccadilly and Victoria lines) – Harringay Green Lanes – Seven Sisters (for South Tottenham and the Victoria line)
- Walthamstow Central (for the Victoria line) – Leyton Midland Road – Leytonstone High Road – Wanstead Park – Woodgrange Park – East Ham (for the District and Hammersmith & City lines) – Barking

At East Ham, eastbound buses will set down only and westbound buses will pick up only.

Use local buses between South Tottenham and Walthamstow Queen's Road or Tube services between Finsbury Park and Walthamstow Central, and between East Ham and Barking.

TfL Rail

Part closure

Saturday: no service between Liverpool Street and Stratford owing to Network Rail track and station improvements and Crossrail construction work. Use the Central line.

DLR

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Stratford and Bow Church owing to Crossrail work at Pudding Mill Lane. Use local buses.

Advance notice of TfL Rail festive closure

There will be no TfL Rail service on the entire line from Saturday December 23 until Monday January 1.

This is while Network Rail carries out improvements including overhead lines modernisation, station improvements and Crossrail construction work. TfL Rail replacement bus services will run, connecting

with the Central line at Newbury Park and Stratford stations. Newbury Park main car park will be closed to allow Greater Anglia and TfL Rail replacement buses to run. Customers are advised to avoid driving to the station during this time.

There are also closures affecting TfL Rail at weekends until December.



Thunderbirds' fans fly across the Thames

VISITORS can immerse themselves in the world of International Rescue on the cable car this autumn.

Travel information that's crystal clear

TRANSPORT for London (TfL) wants to hear people's views on what information it should make publicly available.

In a new consultation launched this week, TfL wants to know how it can further improve its transparency and openness in terms of providing regular information people want, as well as the format in which it should be published.

The organisation already aims to publish as much information as possible. It posts replies to any Freedom of Information requests received on its website along with board papers, and shares live travel information to be used by app developers.
