## London Overground

**Saturday:** No service between Camden Road and Stratford. Use local or rail replacement bus services.

**Saturday:** No service between Gospel Oak and Barking until 8am. Use alternative Tube, local or rail replacement bus services.

**Sunday:** No service between Gospel Oak and Stratford. Use local or rail replacement bus services.

**Sunday:** No service between Wandsworth Road and Clapham Junction. Use local bus services or Southern Railway services between Battersea Park and Clapham Junction.

**All weekend:** No service between Highbury & Islington and Dalston Junction, including Night Overground service. Use local or rail replacement bus services.

**All weekend:** No service between Surrey Quays and New Cross. Use alternative London Overground and local bus services.

**All weekend:** No service between Liverpool Street and Shenfield. Use rail replacement bus services.

## New signage to celebrate diversity

BENGALI language signage has been installed at Whitechapel station, ahead of Elizabeth line services opening later this year.

The dual language signs, which were funded by Tower Hamlets Council, celebrate the contribution of the Bangladeshi community in east London, with Tower Hamlets having the biggest community in the whole of the UK, with around a third of residents being of Bangladeshi heritage.

Mayor Sadiq Khan said: 'London's diversity is its greatest strength. The revamped signs at Whitechapel station recognise and celebrate the vital contribution Bangladeshi Londoners have made in shaping the community in Tower Hamlets and throughout our city.'

When open, the Elizabeth line will have two stations in Tower Hamlets, at Whitechapel and Canary Wharf. It will enable customers to make a direct train journey from Whitechapel through central London to Paddington in just 15 minutes.

## Keep travelling safely

CUSTOMERS are reminded that TfL continues to operate a safe, clean and reliable service, with regular cleaning regimes across the network. While customers are no longer required to wear a face covering, it is still strongly recommended that passengers and staff continue to wear them and be considerate of those around them.

There are UV light devices on more than 100 escalators on the Tube network to clean them continuously around the clock. This measure is on top of an extensive cleaning regime, which includes using hospital-grade cleaning substances that kill viruses and bacteria on contact and provide ongoing disinfection.

The transport network is also well ventilated, with train and bus doors opening frequently to ensure a regular exchange of air throughout journeys.

To help spread demand, passengers are encouraged to make journeys at quieter times. For Tube and rail, these are between

8.45am and 4.30pm and after 6.45pm in the week, and before midday and after 6.45pm at the weekends.

The quieter times for buses are between 8.30am and 3pm and after 5.30pm in the week, and before 11.30am and after 5.30pm at the weekends.

## Green Park escalator works

THERE will be no down escalator to the Jubilee line platforms at Green Park station between 7am and 10am on Mondays to Fridays until early June, owing to maintenance work. A reduced escalator service will be available at other times.

Customers should follow the temporary signs to the Jubilee line platforms and allow more time for their journey. Step-free access will be available during the work and staff will be on hand to provide information.

## Planned Night Tube strike

CUSTOMERS on the Tube are encouraged to check their travel and to plan their journeys ahead of ongoing planned strike action every Friday and Saturday night on the Central and Victoria lines from 7pm. The strike action is planned to continue each weekend until June 19.

Normal Night Tube services are currently expected to run on the Victoria line, while the Central line will run a regular service through central London, with at least two trains per hour.

Customers are advised to check before they travel and use buses to complete their journeys.

All other Tube lines will run their normal daytime services during these strikes, with the last Tubes in central London leaving at around 1am and starting again at 5.30am.

Services from 7pm may be busier than normal as customers seek alternative routes to get around.
