



Second route gets new buses

ROUTE 11 will be the second in the capital to be served entirely by the New Bus for London, from September 21.

The vehicles are the greenest diesel electric hybrid buses in the world, and part of the largest hybrid bus fleet in Europe.

Route 11 runs from Liverpool Street Station to Fulham Broadway via Bank, Mansion House, St Paul's, Ludgate Circus, Fleet Street, Aldwych, Trafalgar Square, Westminster, Victoria,

Sloane Square and Chelsea. It passes some of London's most famous landmarks including Westminster Cathedral, Downing Street, Parliament Square, Horse Guards Parade and St Paul's Cathedral.

During peak hours, 25 of the new buses will be in service carrying the 23,000 people who use the route each day.

Mayor of London Boris Johnson said: 'I am very pleased that we can announce that route 11 will be next to be served by these beautiful, bespoke, economy-boosting buses. They have world-leading environmental credentials and offer an unparalleled passenger experience.'

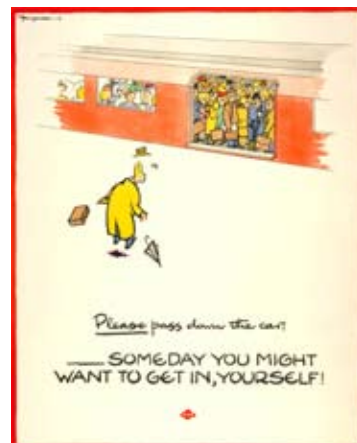
Lean green machine

In recent emissions tests a New Bus for London vehicle that had been in passenger service for eight months, and had driven more than 15,000 miles, was found to emit a quarter of the emissions (nitrogen oxide and particulate matter) of an average hybrid bus and 20 per cent less carbon dioxide.

When all 600 New Bus for London vehicles are in service in 2016, they will reduce carbon dioxide emissions in the capital by around 20,600 tonnes a year.
