Circle line

Full closure

Sunday: No service throughout the whole line, owing to modernisation work. Use alternative Tube routes or local buses instead.

District line

Part closure

Sunday: No service between Edgware Road and High Street Kensington, owing to line modernisation work. Use local buses instead.

Hammersmith & City line

Part closure

Sunday: No service between Hammersmith and Moorgate, owing to line modernisation work. Use alternative Tube routes or local buses instead.

Metropolitan line

Part closure

Sunday: No service between Wembley Park and Aldgate, owing to line modernisation work. Use Jubilee line services between Wembley Park and Baker Street, or Chiltern Railways services between Marylebone and Harrow-on-the-Hill.

London Overground

Part closure

RICHMOND/CLAPHAM JUNCTION TO STRATFORD ROUTE

Sunday: No service between Richmond and Willesden Junction, owing to Network Rail track work. Use District line services between Richmond and Gunnersbury. Rail replacement buses will run between Gunnersbury and Willesden Junction.

HIGHBURY & ISLINGTON TO NEW CROSS/CLAPHAM JUNCTION/CRYSTAL PALACE/WEST CROYDON ROUTE

Sunday: No service between Surrey Quays and Clapham Junction, owing to Network Rail track and infrastructure work. Replacement buses will run.

No service between Surrey Quays and New Cross after 8.45pm, owing to Crossrail construction work. Use local bus route 225 or nearby New Cross Gate for connecting trains via Surrey Quays.

No service between Highbury & Islington and Shadwell after 9.15pm, owing to Crossrail construction work. Use local buses between Highbury & Islington and Dalston Junction, or alternative London Overground trains between Highbury & Islington and Dalston Kingsland. Replacement buses will run between Dalston Kingsland and Shadwell.

TfL Rail

Part closure

Sunday: No service between Liverpool Street and Shenfield until 8.30am, owing to works at Gidea Park.

Replacement buses will operate between Stratford and Romford, and between Newbury Park and Shenfield. Use Central line connections between Liverpool Street and Stratford/Newbury Park.

Getting out and about

THERE'S plenty going on in London this weekend. See below for some of the hottest happenings and details of how to get there.

FIELD DAY AND MIGHTY HOOPLA

Those lucky enough to have nabbed tickets are in for a treat at Brockwell Park. The Field Day Festival opens at 1pm today and at 11.30am tomorrow, with a wide range of music from high-profile international performers. From midday on Sunday, the park plays host to Mighty Hoopla – a colourful celebration of London's alternative club culture.

Getting there: The nearest station to Brockwell Park is Brixton (Victoria line), which is a 12-minute walk. Clapham North (Northern line) is a 22-minute walk. A number of bus routes stop nearby and there is dedicated bike parking. Festival-goers are advised to use public transport or cycle, as there will be no car parking spaces available near the park.

PUSHING BOARDERS

This weekend-long celebration of skateboarding offers a packed programme of talks, films, creative workshops and, of course, skateboarding itself. On Saturday, talks take place from 10am at the Bartlett School of Architecture, while on Sunday

events are based at House of Vans, Waterloo, from midday. Register online for a free place at pushingboarders.com

Getting there: The Bartlett School of Architecture is a three-minute walk from Euston Square station (Circle, Hammersmith & City and Metropolitan lines) and a four-minute walk from Euston (Northern and Victoria lines).

House of Vans is a short walk from Waterloo station (Bakerloo, Jubilee and Northern lines). London Eye Waterloo Pier is also close by.

There are a number of Santander Cycles docking stations near Euston and Waterloo, and several bus routes stop at each location.

LONDON HONG KONG DRAGON BOAT FESTIVAL

This free, family-friendly event takes place on Sunday from 10am at the London Regatta Centre. Visitors will have a chance to enjoy Chinese food and culture while watching some exciting boat racing. Expect traditional dancing, colourful costumes and fierce competition from some of the UK's greatest paddlers.

Getting there: Royal Albert station (DLR) is a five-minute walk from the London Regatta Centre.
