Circle line

Saturday: A reduced service will operate after 6.30pm and there will be no service on the entire line after 9pm. Use alternative Tube or local bus services.

District line

All weekend: No service between Tower Hill and Barking. Use alternative Tube, local or replacement bus services.

Hammersmith & City line

All weekend: No service on the entire line. Use alternative Tube, local or replacement bus services.

Northern line

All weekend: No service between Moorgate and Kennington. Use alternative Tube or local bus services.

London Overground

All weekend: No service between Highbury & Islington and New Cross/New Cross Gate. Use alternative local or replacement buses.

All weekend: No service between New Cross Gate and West Croydon/Crystal Palace. Use alternative local bus and Southern Railway services.

All weekend: No service between Surrey Quays and Clapham Junction. A replacement bus service will run.

TfL Rail

Sunday: A reduced service will run between Paddington and Hayes & Harlington.



Reduced night services

Advice for football fans

AS England prepare for their first game of this summer's Euros against Croatia on Sunday, TFL is advising fans with tickets to Wembley to plan ahead and check before they travel.

Fans may need to queue to enter stations at Wembley for longer than usual after the match. This is to maintain social distancing, in line with government guidelines.

With the prospect of extra time and penalties during the knockout stages of the tournament, customers are reminded that there are no overnight services. Anyone requiring accessible journeys is advised to take the Jubilee or Metropolitan lines to Wembley Park.

Sections of London's transport network will be busier than they have been recently, as the capital hosts one of the UK's first major sporting events since the start of the coronavirus pandemic.

Fans should consider walking or cycling to the stadium if possible, with cycle parking available on street level in the north-east corner of the stadium.

Also on Sunday, Tower Bridge will be closed from 6am for a major public art project to celebrate the European

Championship. There will be five locations across the city, including the bridge, that will be pasted in almost 3,000 black and white portrait photos.

Fans are also reminded that face coverings must be worn over their nose and mouth, unless exempt, and to maintain social distancing where possible on TfL services and at stations.

Hospital-grade cleaning substances are being used across the network, and independent testing has been carried out monthly, with no traces of coronavirus being found. More than 1,000 hand sanitising points are available throughout the network, and 200 UV light devices are continually sanitising escalator handrails.

Pay as you go on contactless and Oyster enables fans to travel flexibly at quieter times by simply touching in and out, reducing the need to queue or buy tickets at a station. Pay as you go fares are also capped so there is no need to buy a Travelcard in advance.

Carry water in hot weather

AS the temperature rises, TFL is reminding customers to carry water with them when travelling on London's public transport during hot weather.
