**GUIDE TO LEARNING THE
'KNOWLEDGE OF LONDON'**



IMPORTANT

This booklet is intended for those who have applied to become licensed taxi drivers in London and whose application has been accepted. It supplements the initial talk given by a Knowledge of London Examiner before you start learning the 'Knowledge'.

If you have not already successfully applied to become licensed you should first read the booklet entitled 'Becoming a Licensed Taxi Driver in London – A Guide for Applicants'.

THE "KNOWLEDGE OF LONDON"

This book is aimed at helping you to gain the necessary knowledge of London to enable you to qualify as an All London cab driver, and also tells you about the Public Carriage Office (PCO) driving test.

Firstly, you may find it helpful to understand some 'Knowledge' terminology.

The 'Knowledge' or 'Knowledge of London' is the process of learning the topography of London, that is the layout, streets and features of the capital.

The PCO is the Public Carriage Office. This office is a branch of Transport for London and licenses London's cabs and cab drivers.

The Blue Book is this guide to learning the 'Knowledge'.

'Runs' are routes between two specified points.

'Points' are where cab journeys start and finish.

An 'appearance' is an appointment at the PCO to be examined on your knowledge of London.

The equipment you need to learn the 'Knowledge'

This Guide to Learning the 'Knowledge of London' has become known as the 'Blue Book' and provides the basis from which to work. In Annex B there are 400 'runs', which you should learn in detail as described below.

You will also require a large scale map of London (at least 3 inches to a mile) which includes the area within a 6-mile radius of Charing Cross.

Finally, you need a call-over partner; that is someone to put questions to you in the way the examiners will. Helpful as members of your family or friends might be, if they have not done, or are not doing, the Knowledge they are of limited use. Most people on the Knowledge come to realise how important it is to have a call-over partner.

What you need to know about London

To achieve the required standard to be licensed as an 'All London' cab driver you will need a thorough knowledge, primarily, of the area within a 6-mile radius of Charing Cross. You will need to know:— all the streets, blocks of flats and offices; government offices and departments; diplomatic premises; town halls; registry offices; hospitals; places of worship; sports stadiums and leisure centres; airline offices; railway stations; hotels; clubs; theatres; cinemas; museums; art galleries; schools; colleges and universities; police stations and headquarters buildings; civil, criminal and coroner's courts; prisons; and places of interest to tourists. These places are also known as 'points'.

You need to be able to travel between **any** two points in this area over the shortest distance.

How to learn the 'Knowledge'

Each Blue book run has a start and finish point. When you get to a start point you need to learn the area within a ¼ mile radius of that point and make a note of the places of interest and important features you see. Take time and trouble to do this, it is important. Work out the most direct route to the finish point and take note of any important features you see along the route. At the end of the run investigate the area within a ¼ mile radius of the finish point for any further important features. It is necessary for you to do this thoroughly so that you cover the required area and build up a good working knowledge.

N.B. *Features are not only points of interest, but also include one-way streets, prohibited turns, etc.*

You will not acquire sufficient knowledge simply by studying a map, there is no substitute for travelling the routes

An example at Annex A demonstrates how to set out a route when you are preparing to learn the 'Knowledge of London'. It also lists the points of interest you should find in the quarter-of-a-mile radius around both the start and finish points, and the points of interest along this particular route.

The process illustrated needs to be repeated for each of the 400 runs in the Blue Book **before** you apply to sit the written test at the PCO. This will take you some time. There is no substitute for constantly travelling the routes. Remember that London is an ever-changing city and 'Knowledge of London' candidates must continually update their knowledge. While you are learning the runs you will need to practice with your call-over partner answering questions in the way Knowledge of London Examiners will expect.

Answering questions on the 'Knowledge'

Once you pass the written test the remainder of your testing will be by way of interviews undertaken by a Knowledge of London examiner. The examiner will first ask you two 'points', the locations of which you will need to identify correctly before you will be allowed to call the 'run'. Having done this you should then give the shortest route between the points. If the places asked for are buildings, sports grounds or similar, you should begin your answer by saying which side of the road the point will be on when you set off, *i.e.*, "Leave on the left/right", locating the building according to the direction in which you will be travelling. Describe the route naming every street travelled along and stating when a change of direction is being taken.

On arrival at the destination you should identify which side of the road the destination is on, *i.e.*, "set down on the left/right", depending on the direction from which approached. Buildings or side turnings on route should **not** be given.

For example, if asked:—

"The Public Carriage Office to the British Museum?"

the correct reply would be:—

"The Public Carriage Office is in Penton Street, and the British Museum is in Great Russell Street."

You would then be asked to join the two places, *i.e.*, describe the route:—

"Leave on right Penton Street, forward Claremont Square, forward Amwell Street, right Margery Street, forward Calthorpe Street, forward Guilford Street, left Russell Square, comply the one-way and leave by Montague Street, right Great Russell Street, set down on right."

Remember that because of one-way streets, no right turns, etc., the forward and reverse routes may be different. You will need to know both directions.

Road works and temporary diversions should be ignored as they will eventually revert. Do not forget roads such as the Westway and Oxford Street. You may be prohibited from using them at the moment, *e.g.*, as a 'learner' driver, but they may be used by cab drivers.

The examinations (known as 'appearances')

Arrive in plenty of time. The examiners work to a tight schedule and if you are late for any reason you will not be seen.

Remember, there are no parking facilities at the Public Carriage Office and there are parking restrictions in the surrounding streets.

The Licensing Authority encourages licensed taxi drivers in London to dress in a manner which reflects favourably upon their profession. In seeking to become licensed you are, therefore, expected to present a clean and smart appearance when attending the Public Carriage Office.

Bring a passport-size photograph of yourself on your first appearance.

Your first appearance will last about 30 minutes, subsequent appearances about 15 minutes. Do not waste too much time trying to remember the answers to the questions; if you do not know the answer, say so.

REMEMBER, THE BLUE BOOK IS JUST A **GUIDE** AND THE QUESTIONS YOU WILL BE ASKED WILL NOT NECESSARILY BE PRECISELY THE SAME.

Knowledge of Suburban London

When you have shown that you have a satisfactory knowledge of central London you will be examined in, and will have to show that you have a good working knowledge of, the suburban areas of the Metropolitan Police District. You will be given a list of a further 66 runs which you will have to learn and for this you will need a map which covers the Greater London area.

The Driving Test

Although you will already have taken one driving test and hold a DVLA full driving licence, the London taxi cab is designed for a special job. You will therefore have to show that you are in total control and are able to make the best use of its particular capabilities so as to give your passengers a smooth, safe and comfortable ride. Being a licensed taxi driver will require you to spend long periods in some of the busiest streets in the world. The examiner will therefore need to judge your ability to concentrate, to "read the road" and assess your relationship with other road users.

When you are approaching the final stages of your Knowledge of London examinations you will be given a form inviting you to apply for a driving test. There is a fee which has to be paid at the time of booking your test and if you fail the first time a further fee will be charged for each subsequent attempt.

You will have to attend for the driving test in a licensed taxicab which is wheelchair accessible.

You will have to produce:

- proof of payment of the test fee;
- a current full DVLA driver's licence;
- a letter from the vehicle owner giving permission for the cab to be used for the test;
- a certificate of insurance stating that the candidate is insured to take the taxi driving test in that vehicle on that day.
- an up to date passport sized photograph.

You will be expected to demonstrate the ability to:

- read a vehicle number plate at the distance specified in the Highway Code (*i.e.*, currently 20.5 metres [67 feet]);

- reverse the vehicle around a left-hand and right-hand turn and straighten up in a roadway 9 feet wide;
- turn the vehicle around in the road to face the opposite direction making no more than three movements and without touching the kerbs;
- load an unfolded, unweighted, wheelchair (which will be provided) into the passenger compartment using the equipment supplied by the vehicle manufacturer and use any passenger securing devices/seatbelts, etc.
- use any other facilities fitted to the vehicle for the benefit of those with disabilities, *e.g.*, intermediate step, swivel seat.

During a drive lasting approximately 30 minutes on the public highway you will be expected to:

- deal with all traffic conditions in a safe and competent manner showing particular regard for the safety and comfort of passengers and other road users;
- demonstrate the ability to stop safely on a gradient and safely pull away and rejoin the traffic stream (this is to simulate picking up or setting down a passenger in difficult conditions);
- complete left- and right-hand turns using mirrors and signals and position the vehicle correctly on the road (special attention will be given to anticipation, vehicle positioning and lane discipline, especially when joining or leaving traffic systems);
- observe traffic signs, road markings and speed restrictions.

You will be required to demonstrate a sound knowledge of:

- the Highway Code (including motorway driving);
- taxi regulations (including taximeter sealing regulations and use of the meter, positioning of the insurance certificate, fire extinguisher and fuel cut-off switch, procedures and regulations relating to cab drivers' licences);
- taxi drivers' responsibilities regarding the Disability Discrimination Act 1995.

If you are successful at the driving test **and** have passed the Knowledge of London test, a pass certificate will be issued which may be taken to the Public Carriage Office at 15 Penton Street where your driver's licence and badge will be issued.

If you are successful at the driving test but have **not** passed the Knowledge of London test, the pass certificate will be returned to the PCO administration office by the driving examiner where it will be retained on your file until such time as the Knowledge of London test has been successfully completed.

If you fail the driving test you will be given a notice indicating the aspects of your driving which require further tuition or improvement. A second test may be requested but must not be less than 14 days after the first test. The interval between any further driving tests will be at least 28 days. A fourth, or any subsequent, test may only be taken after the examiner is satisfied that you have had sufficient driving practice and tuition. As far as is practicable, a different examiner will conduct each of your tests. ***All driving tests and re-tests require payment of the driving test fee.***

Finally

Remember . . .

. . . if you are charged with, convicted of, or cautioned for any offence at any time,

or

. . . if you change your address,

or

. . . if you develop a medical problem which may affect your ability to drive vocationally (or you are prescribed medication which is not compatible with vocational driving),

you must notify the Public Carriage Office immediately. If in doubt about whether you need to notify the PCO — ask.

Annex A

Setting out a Route and the important places adjacent to it

Example of how to set out a route when you are preparing to learn the 'Knowledge of London'

Firstly use your map in conjunction with each run in this book to decide which is the shortest route between the two points and list it as shown below, using the conventions R for right, L for left, F for forward, etc.

Public Carriage Office to British Museum:

Leave on R	Penton Street
F	Claremont Square

R	Margery Street
F	Calthorpe Street
F	Guilford Street
Comply	Russell Square
Leave by	Montague Street
