

Plan your weekend travel

Find out about line closures and alternative travel options at tfl.gov.uk

There are no planned works on the Bakerloo, Central, District, Jubilee, Northern, Piccadilly, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines, TfL Rail or London Trams. However, the following lines will be affected by engineering and improvement works.

Circle line

Part closure

From 9.15pm tonight and all weekend: no service between Hammersmith and Tower Hill owing to track replacement work at Moorgate. A special Circle line service will run between Edgware Road and Barking (via Victoria). Use alternative bus and/or Tube services.

Hammersmith & City line

Part closure

From 9.15pm tonight and all weekend: no service between King's Cross St. Pancras and Barking owing to track replacement work at Moorgate. Use alternative bus and/or Tube services.

Metropolitan line

Part closure

From 9.15pm tonight and all weekend: no service between King's Cross St. Pancras and Aldgate owing to track replacement work at Moorgate. Use alternative bus and/or Tube services.

DLR

Part closure

All weekend: no service between West Ham and Woolwich Arsenal owing to track work. Replacement buses will run between Canning Town and London City Airport (Saturday 9am to 1pm, and Sunday 1pm to 9pm only). Use local buses for other routes. Extra services will run between Woolwich Arsenal and North Greenwich (route 161) and between Canning Town and North Woolwich (route 474).

London Overground

Part closure

Gospel Oak to Barking route

Until October 22: no service between Gospel Oak and Barking owing to Network Rail work to enable new, longer trains to run from spring 2018. Replacement bus services will run:

- Gospel Oak – Upper Holloway – Crouch Hill – Finsbury Park (for the Piccadilly and Victoria lines)
- Haringay Green Lanes – Seven Sisters (for South Tottenham and the Victoria line)
- Walthamstow Central (for the Victoria line) – Leyton Midland Road – Leytonstone High Road
- Wanstead Park – Woodgrange Park – East Ham (for the District and Hammersmith & City lines)
- Barking

At East Ham, eastbound buses will be set down only and westbound buses will pick up only. Use local buses between South Tottenham and Walthamstow Queen's Road or Tube services between Finsbury Park and Walthamstow Central, and between East Ham and Barking.

Richmond/Clapham Junction to Stratford route

Sunday: no service between Camden Road and Stratford owing to bridge replacement works at Highbury Corner. Replacement bus services will run.

Highbury & Islington to New Cross/Clapham Junction/Crystal Palace/West Croydon route

All weekend: no service between Highbury & Islington and Shadwell owing to Crossrail work at Whitechapel. Use alternative London Overground trains between Highbury & Islington and Dalston Kingsland (Saturday only) or local buses (all weekend). Replacement buses will run between Dalston Kingsland and Shadwell.

All weekend: no service between Surrey Quays and New Cross owing to Crossrail work at Whitechapel. Use alternative London Overground trains via New Cross Gate or local buses.

Weekend works at Reading

MAJOR engineering work is taking place in the Reading area this weekend and there will be no Great Western Railway services between Maidenhead and Theale, Newbury and Didcot Parkway. Replacement buses will run between Slough and Theale/Didcot Parkway.

Lighting up Trafalgar Square

TENS of thousands of people are expected in central London this Sunday afternoon for the Diwali celebrations.

Now in its 16th year in the capital, the festival of lights promises to pack Trafalgar Square with lively music and dance, along with an authentic street food market, craft and community stalls, comedy and yoga.

As well as food, drink and entertainment, visitors can learn how to drape a sari, join a Garba performance and practise some new

dance moves in one of the workshops.

There's also a dedicated children's zone with lots of entertainment and activities, and the opportunity to experience mindfulness and meditation.

The festival runs from 1pm until 7pm and the nearest Tube station is Charing Cross (Bakerloo and Northern lines).

A subterranean screening

DON'T miss the rare chance to watch a film in one of London's eight deep-level shelters at Clapham South Underground station.

From October 18 to 22, the underground shelter will host a screening of a bespoke Second World War film reel curated by London Transport Museum. Descend the 180 steps and cosy up underneath a blanket before learning about the realities of being a Londoner during wartime.

Tickets cost £46.50 (concessions £41.50) from www.ltmuseum.co.uk/whats-on. The ticket includes a half-price day pass to London Transport Museum, which must be used within one month of your event date, and a 10 per cent discount at the museum shop. Screenings last one hour.
