

Night Tube celebrates its continued success

BIRTHDAY BOOST AS THE NIGHT TUBE TURNS TWO

RESEARCH released to mark the second anniversary of the Night Tube shows that the service continues to contribute millions more to London's economy than originally projected.

A new report by London First and EY shows that in the past year the Night Tube has helped to generate £190m for the capital – almost £20m more than in its first year of operation. It is predicted to

Demand has grown in its second year, with 8.7million customers

using it in 2017/18, compared to 7.8million in 2016/17.

London Underground's managing director, Mark Wild, said: 'The increase in passenger numbers shows that the demand for the Night Tube remains strong, and that it is helping to transform London into a truly 24-hour city.'

'It has provided a significant boost to London's economy, supporting late night music venues, bars and restaurants, and we look forward to building on this success in the coming years.'

The service has been popular with visitors and Londoners, enabling millions to get home safely, quickly and affordably at night.



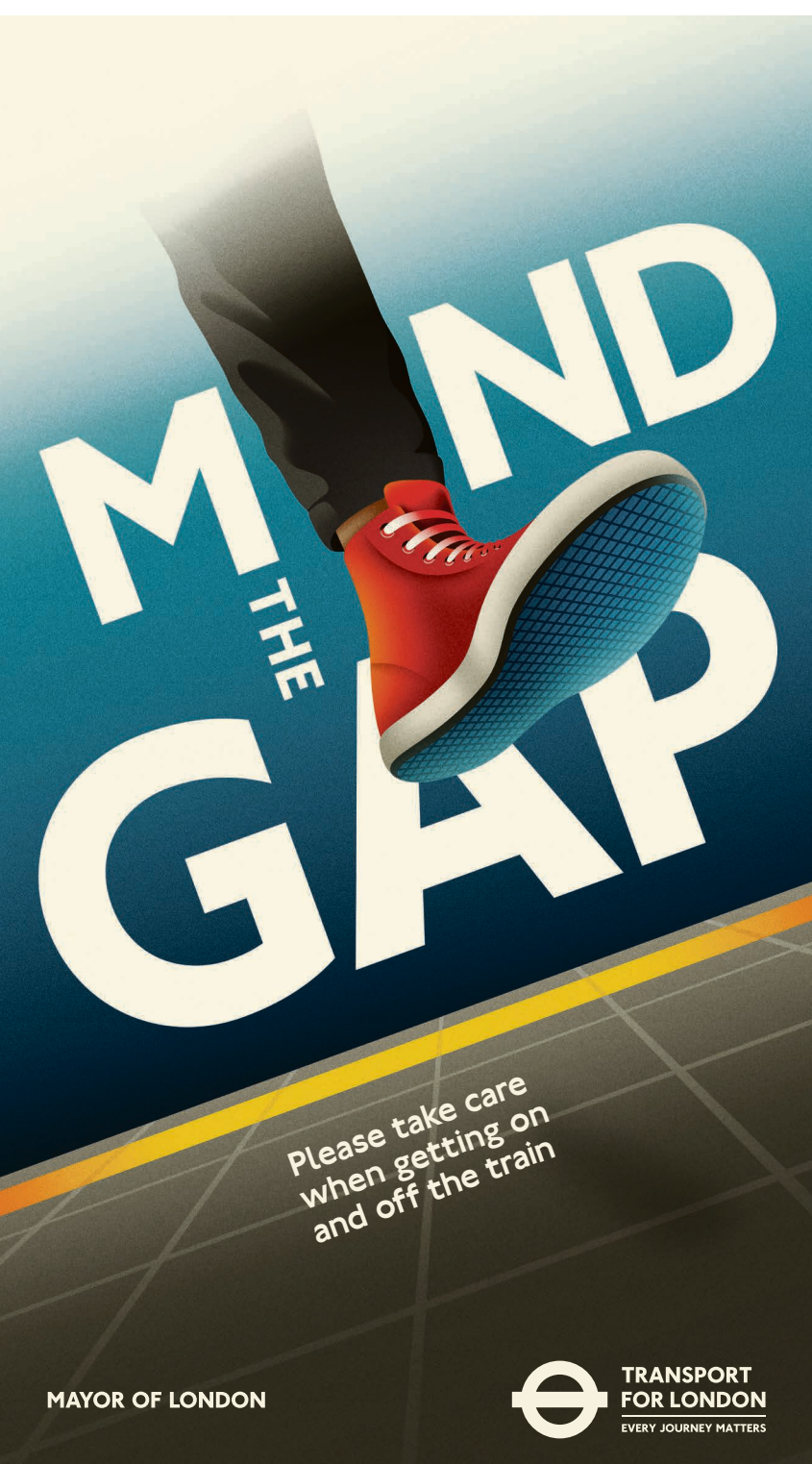

Keep cool and carry on

DURING hot weather, TfL is reminding customers to carry water with them at all times when travelling in London.

This can help you stay hydrated as you make your way around the capital, especially on the Tube. Passengers are also advised to:

- Not board a train or bus when feeling unwell
- Avoid pulling the alarm between stations. If you feel unwell, get off at the next stop and seek help from staff. It is easier for them to give assistance on the platform
- Remember to look up and offer your seat to anyone who may need it more than you

TfL is investing millions of pounds to make the Tube and buses cooler for customers.

There are 192 air-conditioned trains, serving 40 per cent of the network.

All London buses have opening windows and all new double-deck buses use air-cooling systems.
