

# Plan your weekend travel

There are no planned works on the Bakerloo, Central, District, Jubilee, Piccadilly, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines, or on London Trams. However, the following lines will be affected by engineering and improvement works.

## Circle line

### Part closure

**Saturday:** no service between Edgware Road and Hammersmith owing to new signalling testing and track replacement at Latimer Road. Use other Tube services or local buses.

## Hammersmith & City line

### Part closure

**Saturday:** no service between Edgware Road and Hammersmith owing to new signalling testing and track replacement at Latimer Road. Use other Tube services or local buses.

## Metropolitan line

### Part closure

**Sunday:** no service between Aldgate and Wembley Park before 9.30am and after 8.30pm owing to track and signalling work between Baker Street and Finchley Road. Use Jubilee line services.

## Northern line

### Part closure

**Friday Night Tube:** no service between Charing Cross and Stockwell between 12.45am and 1.30am Saturday morning owing to preparations for the Northern line extension. Use night bus N155 or the Victoria line.

## DLR

### Part closure

**All weekend:** no service between Stratford and Bow Church owing to Crossrail works at Pudding Mill Lane. Use local buses.

## London Overground

### Part closure

### Highbury & Islington to New Cross Gate/Clapham Junction/ Crystal Palace/West Croydon route

**All weekend:** no service between New Cross Gate and Crystal Palace/West Croydon owing to Network Rail track work. Replacement buses will run between New Cross Gate and West Croydon.

### Gospel Oak to Barking route

**Sunday:** no service between Gospel Oak and Barking while Network Rail carries out works to enable new, longer trains to run from spring 2018. Replacement bus services will run.

- Gospel Oak – Upper Holloway – Crouch Hill – Finsbury Park (for the Piccadilly and Victoria lines)  
– Haringay Green Lanes – Seven Sisters (for South Tottenham and the Victoria line)
- Walthamstow Central (for the Victoria line) – Leyton Midland Road – Leytonstone High Road  
– Wanstead Park – Woodgrange Park – East Ham (for the District and Hammersmith & City lines)  
– Barking

At East Ham, eastbound buses will set down only and westbound buses will pick up only.

Use local buses between South Tottenham and Walthamstow Queen's Road or Tube services between Finsbury Park and Walthamstow Central, and between East Ham and Barking.

## TfL Rail

### Part closure

**Saturday:** no service between Liverpool Street and Stratford owing to Network Rail track and station improvements, and Crossrail construction work. Use the Central line.



## Open House London

CELEBRATE London's architectural wonders this weekend as Open House London unlocks the doors of hundreds of buildings and spaces around the capital.

Enjoy access to more than 800 churches, museums, public buildings, private houses, schools and offices, and join tours, guided walks and activities throughout the weekend. You can explore buildings that are not usually open to

the public and step into the private homes of the rich and famous.

Admission is free to all Open House events, but some venues and tours require advance booking or entry into a public ballot.

## No lift service at Bermondsey station

FROM Tuesday September 19 until early October, there will be no lift service at Bermondsey station while maintenance work takes place. During this time, customers requiring step-free access should get out at London Bridge station for bus route 47

or at Canada Water for bus route 47 or 188.

Customers starting their journeys at Bermondsey should use the same routes to London Bridge or Canada Water for Jubilee line connections.

## Music to your ears

DON'T miss the chance to see aspiring buskers audition for a coveted pitch on the Underground. From Monday to Friday next week, between 10am and 5pm, talented musicians will perform in front of a panel of judges for a chance to win a busking licence at the following locations:

- Monday September 18 – Canary Wharf station
- Tuesday September 19 – Tottenham Court Road station
- Thursday September 21 – Westminster station
- Friday September 22 – King's Cross St. Pancras station

London Underground launched its licensed busking scheme in 2003 and holds auditions every two years. There were more than 600 applicants this year, with 325 being invited to



audition for one of up to 100 licences.

The winning performers will join the likes of Ed Sheeran, Julian Lloyd Webber, Jessie J, Bob Geldof and Katherine Jenkins who have all busked in the past.

### Did you know?

There are around 40 pitches across 25 central London stations. Some of the busiest spots are at Oxford Circus, King's Cross St. Pancras, Waterloo, Leicester Square and Piccadilly Circus.
