Bakerloo line

All weekend: No service between Queen's Park and Harrow & Wealdstone until 2pm and after 10.30pm on Saturday and all day on Sunday. Rail replacement buses will run all weekend. On Saturday only, a shuttle train service will also run from 2pm until 10.30pm between Queen's Park and Harrow & Wealdstone.

Circle line

Saturday: No service between Edgware Road and Aldgate (via Victoria). Use alternative Tube or local bus services.
Sunday: No service on the entire line. Use alternative Tube or local bus services.

District line

All weekend: No service between Embankment/Edgware Road and Ealing Broadway/Kensington (Olympia)/Richmond/Wimbledon. Use alternative Tube, London Overground or local bus services.
Rail replacement buses will run between Hammersmith and Acton Town/Wimbledon, Turnham Green and Richmond, and between Earl's Court and Wimbledon.

Hammersmith & City line

Sunday: No service between Baker Street and Hammersmith. Use alternative Tube or local bus services.

London Overground

Saturday: No service northbound between Clapham Junction and Willesden Junction until 6.15am. Use local bus services.
Saturday: No service southbound between Willesden Junction and Shepherd's Bush until 6.30am. Use local bus services.
All weekend: No service between Euston and Watford Junction until 2pm and after 10.30pm on Saturday and all day on Sunday. Use alternative Tube, local or rail replacement bus services. A reduced service will run from 2pm until 10.30pm on Saturday.

TfL Rail

Sunday: No service between Paddington and Ealing Broadway until 6.30am. Use alternative Tube or local bus services.

Travelling to Wembley?

FOOTBALL supporters will finally be allowed to swap the sofa for the terraces this weekend, as around 22,000 fans return for the FA Cup Final between Chelsea and Leicester City on Saturday at Wembley Stadium, with kick-off at 5.15pm.

There will be large numbers of pedestrians in the Wembley area all day and traffic levels are expected to be higher than usual before and after the game.

Roads likely to be affected are the A406, A1, A40, Harrow Road, Wembley High Road and roads around the stadium.

Trains on the Bakerloo, Jubilee, Metropolitan, Circle, Hammersmith & City lines, and the London Overground will be busier before and after the game, especially between 1.15pm and 4.45pm, and from 7.30pm to 10pm.

New timetables launch this weekend

FROM Sunday, new timetables will begin operating on the Bakerloo line, London Overground and TfL Rail.

On TfL Rail, there are changes to weekday trains in the morning and evening peaks between Liverpool Street and Shenfield, with trains calling at all stations about every four to six minutes.

Some early morning and late evening train times will change, but there are no changes to weekend services and TfL Rail trains to Heathrow will call at Acton Main Line again.

There will be a slight reduction in frequencies in off-peak trains on the Bakerloo line to improve reliability, but no changes to peak hour trains.

The main changes on the London Overground will see a return to a full service between Liverpool Street and Enfield Town, Cheshunt and Chingford, and from Monday 21 June between Richmond/Clapham Junction and Stratford.

Reduced night services

THIS weekend, there are no Night Tube or Night Overground services. Most Tube services run until about 1am and Night Buses continue to run throughout the weekend.

Other transport options are available, such as taxis and private hire vehicles. Although black taxis can be hailed on the street, private hire vehicles must be booked in advance and customers are advised only to use licensed vehicles.
