## Have your say

TfL is consulting on the following proposals:

### **Holborn station** **Closes November 17**

Give your views on proposals that would substantially improve Holborn station by making it bigger and bringing in step-free access from the street to trains.

### **Old Oak Common Lane/Hythe Road** **Closes November 17**

Have your say on two potential new London Overground stations at Old Oak. Plans include a station interchange at Old Oak, linking London Overground, Elizabeth line and HS2 rail services, and enhancing the area for residents and businesses.

### **Cycle Superhighway 4** **Closes November 19**

This new route would run from Tower Bridge to Greenwich. Proposals would make it safer to cycle and walk in Bermondsey, Rotherhithe, Deptford and Greenwich.

### **Oxford Street** **Closes December 17**

Comment on plans to transform Oxford Street and the areas nearby into one of the world's best outdoor shopping experiences and an unrivalled place to live, work and visit.



### **Rotherhithe and Canary Wharf** **Closes January 8**

TfL is proposing a new river crossing between Rotherhithe and Canary Wharf. It would provide a safe and direct route for pedestrians and cyclists, reduce journey times and encourage more active travel for the growing communities on both sides of the river.
