District line

Saturday: No service between Barking and Upminster, and between Earl's Court and Kensington (Olympia). Use local or rail replacement bus services.

Sunday: No service between Plaistow and Upminster, and between Earl's Court and Kensington (Olympia). Use local or rail replacement bus services.

Hammersmith & City line

Sunday: No service between Plaistow and Barking. Use local or rail replacement bus services.

Piccadilly line

All weekend: No service between Acton Town and Uxbridge. Use alternative Tube and rail replacement bus services.

Elizabeth line

Sunday: No services between Paddington and Ealing Broadway until 7.45am. Use London Underground for services to Paddington, Heathrow or central London.

Sunday: No service on Sundays between Paddington and Abbey Wood until November 6.

London Overground

Sunday: No service between Shepherd's Bush and Willesden Junction. Use local bus services.

Sunday: No service between Barking and Barking Riverside. Use local bus services.

Sunday: No service between Richmond and Willesden Junction, and between Willesden Junction and Gospel Oak via West Hampstead. Use alternative Tube or rail replacement bus services.

National rail services from Victoria station this weekend

THERE will be no Southern rail or Gatwick Express services to or from Victoria this weekend, owing to Network Rail re-signalling work.

For East Croydon and stations between Gatwick Airport and Brighton, use Thameslink services from Blackfriars. Use Southern rail services from London Bridge for other destinations.

Thameslink and Southern tickets will be accepted on the Tube between Victoria and Blackfriars/London Bridge/Balham.

For local journeys, a replacement bus service will be running.

Southeastern services are not affected by the re-signalling works.

New timetable for the DLR

CUSTOMERS will benefit from quicker, easier and more comfortable journeys across the DLR network with the introduction of a new timetable from Monday. The changes will help people access housing, employment and leisure opportunities more easily across Docklands and east London.

All DLR routes will benefit from more frequent services at certain times, helping to reduce waiting times and minimise crowding, especially at the busiest times.

ALL CHANGE

Services between Stratford and Canary Wharf will be increased from one train every six to seven minutes to every four minutes during weekday peak times.

During daytimes and early evenings, trains will run every five minutes instead of every ten minutes. In the weekday morning peak, every other train will continue to Lewisham, providing a service every two to four minutes between Canary Wharf and Lewisham at these times.

The Canning Town to Beckton shuttle is being reintroduced during off-peak times and being introduced for the first time during the peak. This will complement existing services, meaning a service will operate on the route every four minutes during the weekday peaks, and every five minutes during off-peak daytimes throughout the week.

More frequent services will also run for longer in the evening and on weekends. For example, on weekday evenings, services between Bank and Lewisham will run every five minutes rather than every ten minutes.

Since the opening of the Elizabeth line

and with people travelling to the office and leisure activities more frequently, the way customers use the DLR has changed. The new timetable will help ensure there are more trains available where people need them, with most routes seeing either no change to train length or shorter but more frequent trains, giving either an increase to, or no change in, capacity.

The changes will also help minimise interchange waiting times with the Elizabeth line at Canary Wharf, Custom House and Stratford stations – making journeys across the city even quicker.

With Elizabeth line services being integrated from Sunday November 6, DLR customers will be only one change away from key destinations in the capital, such as the West End and Heathrow Airport.

A LOOK TO THE FUTURE

Further improvements will be made across the DLR network including modern, walk-through, air-conditioned trains, which are due to enter service from 2024.

These will provide further significant enhancements to waiting times, crowding and customer experience, as well as supporting housing growth and economic redevelopment across the Docklands and east London.

Customers can plan journeys ahead of these changes by using the TfL Go app or TfL Journey Planner.

TfL will monitor the changes, including reviewing customer and staff feedback, to ensure it is delivering as intended for customers.
