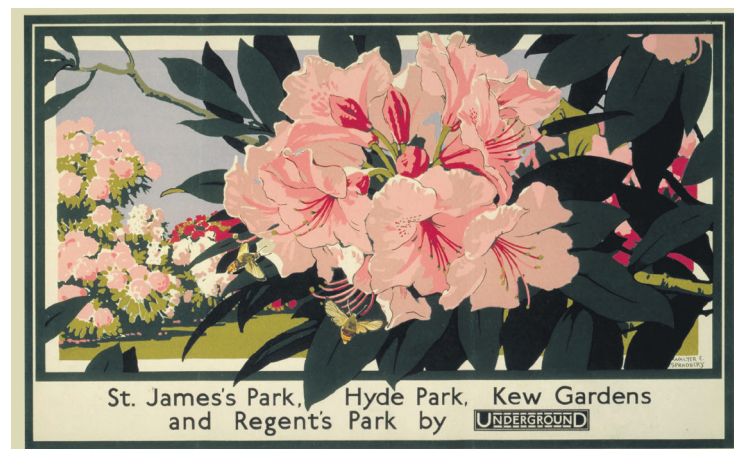

## Get on your bike
