



Travel disruption: TfL is advising customers not to travel ahead of a week of strikes

Planned strike action tomorrow

MAJOR TRAVEL DISRUPTION TOMORROW AS A WEEK OF STRIKE ACTION BEGINS

CUSTOMERS are being strongly encouraged not to travel tomorrow, unless strictly necessary, owing to planned industrial action being taken by the RMT and Unite unions.

This planned strike comes at the start of a week of travel disruption across the country, which will impact London Underground, London Overground and Elizabeth line services until Sunday June 26.

TfL expects there to be severe disruption or no service on all London Underground lines if the strike goes ahead, with no services running before 8am on Wednesday. Customers are encouraged to avoid making journeys until mid-morning on Wednesday.

If customers cannot avoid travelling, they should expect severe disruption on the Tube, and are advised to plan ahead and leave more time for journeys.

Anyone using any London Underground services that are operating are advised to complete their journey by 6pm.

London Overground services will run a reduced service from 7.30am, with customers advised to complete their journeys by 6pm.

Services on the Elizabeth line will be running across the central section from 6.30am, but customers

should complete their journeys by 6pm on strike days. There will be a reduced Elizabeth line service between Paddington and Reading from 7.40am, and between Shenfield and Liverpool Street from 7.30am. Customers should complete their journeys by 4pm on the days of the strike.

Services that are running, including buses and DLR, are likely to be extremely busy with queues to board. Customers using DLR services from stations that are also served by London Underground are advised to check before they travel due to possible station closures.

Walking or cycling may be quicker and easier for some journeys. Santander Cycles bikes will be available and rental e-scooters are also available to hire in some London boroughs.

NATIONAL STRIKES

The RMT and Unite's action on the Tube network tomorrow coincides with RMT strike action across national rail services.

There will be a reduced service on the London Overground and Elizabeth line on the days when strike action is planned – which is tomorrow, Thursday and Saturday – owing to the national rail strike

and its impacts on the shared track and assets.

On Thursday and Saturday, London Underground will operate as much of the network as possible. However, there will be no service between Queen's Park and Harrow & Wealdstone on the Bakerloo line and the Richmond and Wimbledon branches of the District line will only operate between 7.30am and 6.30pm. The Waterloo & City line will operate as usual on Thursday June 23 but has a planned closure on Saturday June 25.

There is also the potential for disruption due to the strike impacting London Underground staff availability, meaning customers should still check before they travel.

Disruption from the national rail strike will affect customers on the mornings when no strike action is planned, so on Wednesday, Friday and Sunday. London Underground customers using sections of lines affected by national rail strike action are encouraged to avoid making journeys until mid-morning on each of these days.

Strike summary

HERE is a quick guide to the services that will run and the impacts the strike will have on customers.

MONDAY JUNE 20

Normal service will run on the London Underground and national rail services.

TUESDAY JUNE 21

Avoid travelling unless necessary. The Underground will be running a very limited shuttle service but customers should complete their journeys by 6pm.

The central section of the Elizabeth line will run from 6.30am but customers should complete their

journeys by 6pm. There will be a reduced service between Paddington and Reading from 7.40am, and between Shenfield and Liverpool Street from 7.30am. Customers should complete their journeys by 4pm.

London Overground will run a reduced service from 7.30am and customers should complete their journeys by 6pm. There will also be a reduced service running on London Trams.

WEDNESDAY JUNE 22

The strikes will end at 8am, but customers should expect delays to continue until mid-morning.
