

Plan your weekend travel

Find out about line closures and alternative travel options at tfl.gov.uk

There are no planned works on the Bakerloo, Central, Jubilee, Metropolitan, Northern, Piccadilly, Victoria and Waterloo & City lines. There are also no planned works on the DLR or London Trams. However, engineering and improvement works will affect the following services:

Circle line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Baker Street and Hammersmith/High Street Kensington via Bayswater. Trains will operate between High Street Kensington and Barking (via Victoria) and between High Street Kensington and Baker Street (via Aldgate).

District line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between High Street Kensington and Edgware Road, for track replacement work. Before 9am and after 9pm there will also be no service between Kensington (Olympia) and Earl's Court.

Hammersmith & City line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Hammersmith and Baker Street. There will be a reduced service on the rest of the line.

London Overground

Part closure

Romford to Upminster route

All weekend: no service between Romford and Upminster, owing to Crossrail construction work. Use local bus route 370.

TfL Rail

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Stratford and Shenfield. Use the Central line for travel between Stratford and Newbury Park. Replacement buses will run:

- Stratford City – Forest Gate (Romford Road) – Manor Park (Romford Road) – Ilford – Seven Kings – Goodmayes – Chadwell Heath (Wangey Road) – Romford
- Newbury Park – Chadwell Heath (Wangey Road) – Romford – Gidea Park – Harold Wood – Brentwood – Shenfield

Escalator works at Liverpool Street

FROM Monday, there will be a temporary one-way system in place at Liverpool Street Tube station while TfL refurbishes three escalators connecting the Central line platforms to the main ticket hall.

Work will continue until late 2018, with repairs carried out on one escalator at a time to minimise disruption. Customers are advised that between 7am and 10am on weekdays

there will be two up escalators in service, providing exit only. Access to Central line services during peak times will be via the entrances next to platforms 1 and 10 on the National Rail concourse.

At all other times, there will be one up and one down escalator in service to provide access to and from the Central line and ticket hall.

Night Overground route extended

THOUSANDS of customers will benefit from extended Night Overground services to Canonbury and Highbury & Islington from next Friday.

The expanded route will link the Overground with the Night Tube on the Victoria line for the first time, making late night travel even quicker and easier.

The new connections in north London will help more people enjoy the city's vibrant nightlife and support local businesses, while boosting the capital's night-time economy.

Frequent and reliable services between north and east London will also benefit night shift workers including hospital staff, the emergency services and those in the hospitality sector.

The Mayor of London, Sadiq Khan, said: 'Following our hugely successful launch of the Night Tube, I'm delighted that we will be able to extend the Night Overground service to help even more Londoners.'

'These night-time services are providing a huge boost to our economy and a safe and reliable way for people to travel across the capital, helping all those working hard during the night or out enjoying everything London's nightlife has to offer.'

Night Overground services currently run all night on Friday and Saturday between New Cross Gate and Dalston Junction.
