DLR

All weekend: Eastbound trains will not stop at London City Airport station. If you are travelling towards Woolwich Arsenal, change at King George V station to travel back to London City Airport. To travel eastbound from London City Airport, change at Pontoon Dock.

London Overground

Sunday: No service between New Cross Gate and Crystal Palace/West Croydon. Rail replacement buses will run. Southern Rail trains will also not be running.



Reduced night services

THIS weekend, there are no Night Tube or Night Overground services. Most Tube services run until about 1am and Night Buses continue to run throughout the weekend.

Night Tube services on the busiest Central and Victoria lines will resume

on Saturday November 27, while the Night Overground will resume between Highbury & Islington and New Cross Gate from December 17.

Going through Canada Water?

THERE will be no step-free access to the Jubilee line and London Overground at Canada Water station on Tuesday and Wednesday next week for lift maintenance works. Customers who need step-free access to the Jubilee line can use local bus services from stop B1 to Bermondsey.

Customers for the London Overground can take bus route 225 from stop B2 to reach New Cross/New Cross Gate and take London Overground services from there.

Anyone travelling to Queens Road Peckham or Honor Oak Park can take bus route P12 from stop C. Anyone travelling to Forest Hill, Sydenham, Crystal Palace, Anerley and West Croydon can take bus route P12 from stop C to Honor Oak Park and then take a southbound London Overground service.

IT may be getting chilly outside, but there are masses of things to see and do around London this weekend. So, wrap up warm, get outside and enjoy!

TAKE IT TO THE BANKSY

Seen by more than one million people worldwide in cities from Melbourne and Tel Aviv to Toronto and Chicago, The Art of Banksy exhibition has now made its home in London. It features original and authenticated works from one of the most intriguing and talked-about artists in modern history, including iconic favourites such as 'Girl with a Balloon' and 'Rude Copper', alongside 'Brace Yourself' featuring a dodgem-riding Grim Reaper.

The exhibition is open until next May at 50 Earlham Street, Covent Garden. Tickets cost from £14.50, while children under six go free. You must book your tickets in advance at artofbanksy.co.uk

FONTASTICAL GAMES

If you're quick, you can still snap up tickets for this evening's After Dark event at London Transport Museum in Covent Garden. Sarah Hyndman, author of the bestselling Why Fonts Matter, will be hosting this quiz about typography in all its forms. There will be a chance to explore the museum while it is free from crowds and there's a pop-up bar where you can sample the yummy Routemaster cocktail.

LORD MAYOR OF LONDON

Tomorrow sees the pomp and pageantry of the Lord Mayor's Show return to the City of London. This free event centres around an impressive procession with full-size model elephants, Japanese drummers, the tallest fire engine in Europe, funfair rides and horse parades. Do check your travel before setting off as the streets in the City will be closed to traffic for the procession, so the best ways to travel are by Tube or on foot.
