HEAD TO LONDON TRANSPORT MUSEUM FOR A GREEN-THEMED GREAT DAY OUT

WITH the half-term holidays only a few weeks away, London Transport Museum has a fun-packed week lined up to keep the kids (and big kids) entertained.

The activities are green-themed, as part of the museum's new Climate Crossroads programme, which aims to get people thinking about how to protect the climate.

Families can follow a self-guided trail around the galleries and discover how different types of public transport have shaped the capital's environment over the past 200 years, from the early days of steam power to the engineering helping Londoners make greener journeys today.

Youngsters can get involved in interactive science, technology,

engineering and mathematics (STEM) inspired activities and meet real-world engineers as they explore the technology powering London's new 'green' buses.

Plus, there's the chance to take part in a colourful interactive art installation celebrating the wildlife that call London's parks, railway tracks and green spaces home.

Children can get creative as they draw the animals they find 'living' among the historic vehicles, including foxes, herons and hedgehogs, before adding their illustrations to a collaborative artwork about the city, its transport and inhabitants.

There are also transport-inspired storytelling sessions for little ones to enjoy.

Sam Mullins OBE, director of London Transport Museum, said: 'As the world turns its attention to COP26, our Climate Crossroads programme is encouraging families to be creative and curious about the part they can play in protecting our planet, from the journeys we make to how careers in engineering and transport help to shape the future.' Activities take place from Saturday October 23 to Sunday October 31, from 10am until 4pm.

Adult tickets cost £18.50, and double up as an annual pass that lets you visit as many times as you like within a year. Children aged 17 and under go free.
