Night Tube
Service

Northern line joins the Night Tube network this evening

There are no planned works on the Bakerloo, Central, Jubilee, Metropolitan, Northern, Piccadilly, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines, DLR or TfL Rail. The following lines will be affected.

Circle line

No service

All weekend: no service on the line while new signalling is tested and track replaced at Monument. Use alternative Tube and/or bus services.

District line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Embankment and Dagenham East. This is to allow new signalling to be tested, track replaced at Monument and Barking, and Crossrail construction work at Whitechapel. Replacement bus services will run:

Service A: Tower Hill – Aldgate – Aldgate East – Whitechapel – Stepney Green – Mile End – Bow Road – Stratford (for the DLR, Central and Jubilee lines, TfL Rail and London Overground) – Upton Park – East Ham – Barking.

Service C: Barking – Upney – Becontree – Dagenham Heathway – Dagenham East.

Hammersmith & City line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Liverpool Street and Barking. This is to allow new signalling to be tested, track replaced at Monument and Barking, and Crossrail construction work at Whitechapel. Trains will run to/from Aldgate instead. Replacement buses will run between Tower Hill and Barking (via Aldgate) – see Service A in the District line entry for details.

London Overground

Part closure

Richmond/Clapham Junction to Stratford route

Sunday: no service between Willesden Junction and Camden Road (via West Hampstead) owing to Network Rail infrastructure work. Replacement buses will call at: Willesden Junction – Kensal Rise – Queen's Park (use local buses for Brondesbury Park) – Brondesbury – West Hampstead – Finchley Road (for Finchley Road & Frognal) – Hampstead Heath – Gospel Oak (bus stops in Agincourt Road/Southampton Road) – Kentish Town West (bus stops in Prince of Wales Road) – Camden Road. London Overground trains will run along an alternative route from Willesden Junction, calling at Kensal Green, Queen's Park, Kilburn High Road, South Hampstead, then Camden Road and all stations to Stratford.

Highbury & Islington to New Cross/Clapham Junction/Crystal Palace/West Croydon route

All weekend: trains will not stop at Whitechapel owing to Crossrail construction work. Use local buses between Shoreditch High Street and Shadwell via all reasonable routes.

Gospel Oak to Barking route

Until February: no service between Gospel Oak and Barking owing to Network Rail work to enable new, longer trains to run from 2018. Replacement bus services will run:

Service J: Gospel Oak (bus stops in Highgate Road) – Upper Holloway – Crouch Hill (bus stops in Hornsey Road) – Finsbury Park (Tube) – Harringay Green Lanes – Seven Sisters (for South Tottenham).

Service T: Walthamstow Central – Leyton Midland Road – Leytonstone High Road (bus stops at Harrow Green) – Wanstead Park – Woodgrange Park – East Ham – Barking.

At East Ham, eastbound buses will set down only and westbound buses will pick up only. Use local buses between South Tottenham and Walthamstow Queen's Road. Use Tube services between Finsbury Park and Walthamstow Central.

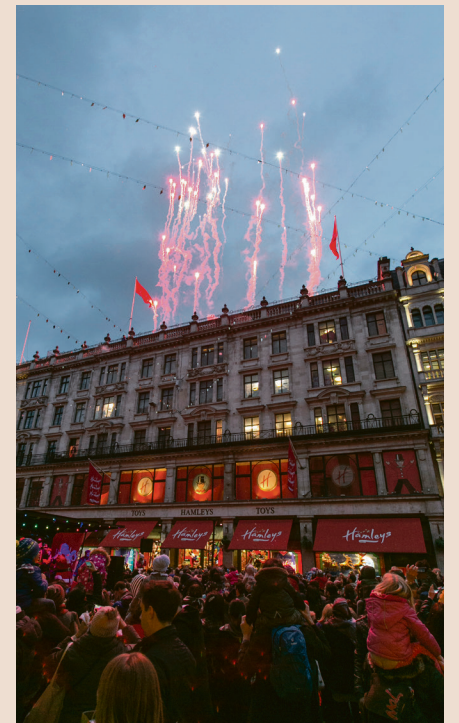

Weekend events affecting journeys

THERE will be a march tomorrow between Park Lane and Millbank from midday until 4pm. Road closures will be in place between 11am and 6pm, and bus services in central London will be disrupted.

On Sunday, the Hamleys Regent Street Christmas Parade (pictured) takes place from 11am until 5pm. Regent Street will be closed between Oxford Street and Piccadilly Circus. Buses in and around Regent Street will be on diversion or stop short of their destination.

Tube and rail will be the best way to get around central London this weekend. Plan ahead to avoid any delays to your journey.



Travel advice for Winter Wonderland

HYDE Park's Winter Wonderland opens at 5pm today. It's open daily (except Christmas Day) 10am-10pm until January 2.

During this time, nearby stations will be busier than usual. As a result, crowd management systems will be in place and it may not be possible to travel home the same way you arrived. When leaving the venue you may be

diverted away from Hyde Park Corner station in the afternoons or early evenings. Also, Marble Arch will at times have a one-way system in place. Visitors are advised to use Green Park, Knightsbridge or Victoria stations.
