**All weekend:** No service between Acton Town and Uxbridge. Use alternative Tube or rail replacement bus services.

## London Overground

**Sunday:** No service between Richmond and Camden Road until 11am. Use alternative Tube or rail replacement bus services.

**Sunday:** No service between Gospel Oak and Barking. Use alternative Tube, local or rail replacement bus services.

**Sunday:** No service between Hackney Downs and Enfield Town/Cheshunt. Use alternative Tube, Greater Anglia, local or rail replacement bus services.

**Sunday:** No service between Willesden Junction and Clapham Junction until 9.30am. Use local bus services.

**Sunday:** No service between Willesden Junction and Shepherd's Bush until 11am. Use local bus services.

## Elizabeth line

**Sunday:** No service between Paddington and Abbey Wood. Use alternative Tube services.

## Keep travelling safely

CUSTOMERS are reminded that TfL continues to operate a safe, clean and reliable service, with regular cleaning regimes across the network.

TfL is encouraging staff and customers to take appropriate action to keep themselves safe – including using hand sanitiser and wearing a face covering if this helps them travel with confidence.

To help spread demand, passengers are encouraged to make journeys at quieter

times. For Tube and rail, these are between 8.45am and 4.30pm and after 6.45pm in the week, and before midday and after 6.45pm at weekends.

The quieter times for buses are between 8.30am and 3pm and after 5.30pm in the week, and before 11.30am and after 5.30pm at weekends.

## Planned Night Tube strike

CUSTOMERS are encouraged to check their travel and to plan ahead of ongoing planned strike action every Friday and Saturday night on the Central, Jubilee, Northern and Victoria lines from 7pm. The planned action has been extended to December 4.

## Celebrating Pride at TfL

TO commemorate 50 years of Pride in London, TfL is displaying a collection of LGBT+ community and people-focused posters across the transport network.

The posters tell unique stories from a range of LGBT+ communities and businesses and shine a spotlight on the role, legacy and support they provide for their peers. Through these stories, TfL hopes to highlight the diverse LGBT+ communities that live and work in London, and how public transport connects them. The posters will be displayed in TfL stations, including on the Elizabeth line for the first time.

### PROUD CONTRIBUTIONS

Among the contributors are The Cocoa Butter Club, an award-winning performance company for performers of colour, and Gay's The Word, the UK's oldest LGBT+ independent bookshop.

Some of the posters will feature the historic Polari language, a secret language used by the LGBT+ community in the past to chat in public that fell out of use when homosexuality was decriminalised in 1967.

Portraits of more than 20 TfL employees and contractors will be on display in Vauxhall and Green Park Tube stations and Poplar DLR station. They tell the stories of

staff members being their authentic selves in their roles and are designed to encourage others to do the same. There will also be posters designed by staff members, expressing their creative take on Pride, including messages of encouragement.

### HEADING TO THE PARADE

TfL is proud to have been part of the Pride parade since 2006. A decorated electric bus will join the parade tomorrow, and TfL supporters will march under banners of the Women, Faith, RACE, Carers, Parent and Guardians, and Disability Staff Network groups as well as the LGBT+ banner to highlight the many aspects of the LGBT+ communities in London.

Anyone heading to the parade should plan their journey in advance and choose a location outside a Tube station to meet friends, to help reduce overcrowding.

There's a new route this year, starting in Hyde Park at Marble Arch, and the nearest Tube stations are Marble Arch (Central line) or Bond Street (Central and Jubilee lines).
